Communication Demonstration/Practice, Tri-City CERT Graduation Drill, October 26, 2019



Every April and October, the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT, https://www.ready.gov/CERT/) classes practice their skills at the joint Richmond-El Cerrito-San Pablo (and Crockett) Final Drill. Graduating classes from each city are shadowed by a radio operator to keep classes on schedule and to report their status. The drill also exposes students on capabilities of radio communication in a disaster. On October 26, 2019, Alvin, KK6UQX and Carrie, KK6BKR assisted to ensure to drill's success, as requested by City of Richmond's Office of Emergency Services. Dj, KJ6DJ, came to visit and offered his support.

Jeff, KJ6RHF and Wing, K6YDE assisted at the Scenario-based Exercise, where students combined all the skills they had learned, and took turns being rescuers or victims in and around a building after an earthquake scenario.




Technical Committee

Club Repeater Solar Power Project



After the 4C's membership voted to solarize the repeaters power in Spring 2019, **Jay**, **KJ6WSS** volunteered to lead the project. The physical work was completed on Friday, October 25, when the power to the repeaters was switched over to batteries charged by solar. The PG&E Public Safety Power Shutdown on the next day in El



Sobrante came close to the 4C's repeater site, highlighting the importance of the project.

All labor for the solar project was volunteered. Jay and Howdy, KE6BEE performed most of the physical work. Edward Carney, KM6UBY; Michael Cohen, KM6WEX; and Mathison Ott, KJ6DZB pitched in to hoist and stabilize the heavy components. Jay worked solo most of the time, preparing for the installation of the modules and doing housekeeping.

Excluding Jay's design time, the physical work took about $3\frac{1}{2}$ months, mostly on weekends. The project was delayed for two

weeks due to the road to the repeater site was blocked by EBMUD construction.

Except for the new secondary battery purchased by 4C's, all materials and supplies were donated. Howdy donated eight solar collector modules, a new charge controller and wiring supplies. Jay and **Karen**, **KK6ZPM** donated all materials for the support structure, and Jay used the old company stake side truck for multiple hauls up and down the hill. *Karen*, *KK6ZPM contributes to this report*.

08/10/2019 Jay transported the new battery to the container

08/23 Jay dug holes for three of the concrete piers. The fourth pier would be secured to an existing slab

08/27 Forms, built in Jay's shop, were set in the holes

08/27 The fourth form doweled to slab

08/27 All forms in place, leveled and ready for pour ►
