For those who are unfamiliar, the Derby Started in 1956, and is one of the oldest and largest fishing derbys in the state and derby days are Seward's busiest fishing days each year, with thousands coming to town to cast their line for the chance to win the "big one!" Founded in 2007, the purpose of the American Legion Auxiliary Foundation is to assist in carrying out the educational, charitable, and other purposes of the Auxiliary by raising funds for, assisting in and providing support to the Auxiliary programs.

The programs that are supported by this foundation help our veterans and their families through the VA and their rehabilitative services. It also supports Girls State and many Children and Youth programs. Additionally, the ALA programs promotes citizenship, patriotism and leadership in communities across the nation.

As a 501 (c)(3) it is a fully non-profit entity and relies heavily on corporate and private donors. Donors contribute to furthering the ALA mission and it is a way to secure our legacy and heritage of "Service Not Self," ultimately enhancing the quality of life for future generations of veterans, military and their families.

<u>August 4th is National Coast Guard Day</u> and it is celebrated on the birthday of the U.S. Coast Guard. The Coast Guard was founded on August 4th 1790. This day honors the military branch that protects our waters and shorelines. The Coast Guard has been continuously at sea since its inception, although the name Coast Guard didn't come about until 1915 when the Revenue Cutter Service was merged with the Lifesaving Service. The Lighthouse Service joined the Coast Guard in 1939, followed in 1946 by the Bureau of Navigation and Steamboat Inspection. Then in 1967, after 177 years in the Treasury Department, the Coast Guard was transferred to a newly formed Department of Transportation. Finally, on March 1, 2003, the Coast Guard was transferred to the Department of Homeland Security.

The USCGC Mustang is stationed in Seward and the crew of the

Mustang has always been great in their support of the Post 5 Family for many years. We would like to acknowledge them and their families for their service to our great country and recognize the sacrifices they have made to serve. The "Cutter Mustang" is a great addition to our town!





National Purple Heart Day honors the men and women

who have been wounded or killed in military service. An important day for us to all remember those who have served to keep us free and the many who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

Also, another important day in the history of the U.S is <u>VJ Day</u> (Victory over Japan Day). Exactly what day it is celebrated is a little confusing:

August 14th - Japan surrendered

August 15th - the surrender is announced to the world. The day that is most commonly recognized and celebrated in modern days.

September 2 - the formal surrender ceremony was held in Tokyo Bay aboard the **USS Missouri** and formal signing of the surrender occurred. At that time President Truman declared September 2nd to be VJ Day.

VJ Day marks the end of WWII and the end of fighting against Japan. It is called Victory in Japan Day or Victory over Japan Day. Regardless of what day it is celebrated it marked the end of WWII and the fighting between the US and Japan.

It is important to remembers these days in history and remember the men and women who served during this time. Many of them making the ultimate sacrifice for their country.
