No. 1 Constitutional Amendment. Article IX, Section 4 and Article XII Partisan Election of Members of **District School Boards**

Proposing to require members of district school boards to be elected in a partisan election rather than a nonpartisan election.



No. 2 Constitutional Amendment, Article I, Section 28

Right to Fish and Hunt

Proposing to preserve forever fishing and hunting, including by the use of traditional methods.

No. 3 Constitutional Amendment, Article X, Section 29

Adult Personal Use of Marijuana

Allows adults 21 years or older to possess, purchase, or use marijuana products and marijuana accessories for non-medical personal consumption; allows Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers, and other state licensed entities, to acquire, cultivate, process, manufacture, sell, and distribute such products and accessories.
