

Access Center FAQ for Families *Last updated: August 19 2020 This page will be updated with new information as it becomes available. Check back frequently.*

The **City of Philadelphia** is partnering with community-based organizations to open **Access Centers** that will support Philadelphia children and their families this fall during digital-learning time. Access Centers will be free of charge and located in neighborhoods to serve Philadelphia's most vulnerable children.

Please take a look at some frequently asked questions below for more information about the Access Centers. Registration information will be available on phila.gov beginning the week of August 24.

How do I register my child for a slot at one of the Access Centers?

- Registration will be available via phone and online form on phila.gov starting the week of August 24.

What are the requirements to register for a slot at the Access Centers?

- Philadelphia students are eligible to register if they:
 - are entering Kindergarten through 6th grade.
 - are children of caregivers working outside the home who cannot provide supervision or are not able to afford childcare.
 - have no in-home internet. (Note: up to 35,000 eligible K-12 households can use [PHLConnectEd](#) to get free internet service. [Find out more.](#))

When will Access Centers open?

- The first phase of Access Centers will begin operations at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, September 8. Additional locations will be added on a rolling basis.

How many children will the first phase of Access Centers serve?

- The first phase of 31 Access Centers will serve around 800 children. Individual sites will vary in the number of slots available for students, but most sites will serve 22 children. 1

Can families change Access Centers once registered at one?

- For the purpose of maintaining safety in cohorts, it is not advised that children change Access Centers.

What are the hours for the Access Centers?

- Access Centers will be open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and will align with the School District of Philadelphia's 2020-2021 Academic Calendar.

Can families sign up for certain days each week?

- The centers are targeting families who need care for the entire week. However, we recognize that there are various work schedules and plan to accommodate families who need their students to attend at least three days per week.

Will the sites provide food?

- Access Centers will provide students with lunch. All lunches will be pre-made and sealed. Refrigeration is also required in the event students have special dietary restrictions.

Will the sites provide computers for students?

- Students should bring their school-issued Chromebook or other digital device with them.

Will transportation to Access Centers be provided?

- Families are expected to take care of drop-off and pickup, in order to help minimize contact and mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Eligible families can look for a center located in their neighborhood (near their home or work) as part of the registration process.

Who will staff the centers?

- Access Centers will be staffed by both City employees and staff from the City's Out-of-School Time provider network. All staff will have appropriate clearances.

Will staff have PPE?

- All staff will be given proper PPE each day and will be required to use it accordingly. In the event students arrive without the proper PPE, it will be given to them.

What strategies will the Access Centers use to mitigate the spread of COVID-19?

- Strategies for mitigating the spread of COVID-19 include temperature checks every morning, designated entrances and exits, ensuring that all students are spaced six-feet apart and stay within their cohorts, deep sanitization of all spaces before opening and after the last student has departed, and isolation rooms for any students that show symptoms of COVID-19 during the day.
- They will also operate in compliance with the Philadelphia Department of Public Health guidelines to mitigate infection. All staff will be given proper PPE each day and will be required to use it accordingly. If students arrive without PPE, it will be given to them before entering the building.
