CHI vs SAS

When you're in need of assistance it's easy to get confused at to who you spoke with and who you're working with. One of the biggest misconceptions we come across are people thinking Centralized Housing Intake (CHI) and the Shenandoah Alliance for Shelter (SAS) are one in the same. I wanted to take the opportunity to explain the difference. With our state and federally funded housing programs we are required to have a coordinated entry system to access the programs we administer. Our coordinated entry system is called 'Centralized Housing Intake." By "our" I mean the entire Continuum of Care. People that are experiencing a housing crisis within our Continuum of Care (Counties of Shenandoah, Page, Warren, Clarke, Frederick, and Rockingham and the cities of Winchester and Harrisonburg) would contact this line where a Centralized Housing Intake Coordinator would complete an eligibility screening. If the coordinator deems the household eligible for a referral, they would send that referral to the agency that covers that households area where the referred agency would make a final determination of eligibility, and they would be the ones to provide financial assistance. Peep the chart below!

01. PURPOSE

Screens housing calls for program eligibility. Makes referrals to funded agencies. i.e Shenandoah Alliance for Shelter.

01. PURPOSE

Assess housing referrals received from Centralized Housing Intake.

02. **ELIGIBILITY**

Makes an initial determination of eligibility based on information the client states at the time of intake.

03. **ASSISTANCE**

Does **NOT** provide ANY financial assistance



02.

ELIGIBILITY

Makes a final determination of eligibility based on collected information from the client.

03.

ASSISTANCE

Provides financial assistance

04. EFFORT

Once a referral is **sent** to the agency the client is no longer working with Centralized Housing Intake.

Contact ends.

04. EFFORT

Once a referral is received by the agency the client is now working with the agency.

Contact starts.
