#### A. MERS Unfunded Liability:

# XI. NEW BUSINESS:

# A. John Chiera – 5804 Dryden Road:

John Chiera addressed concerns about about being annexed into the village and receiving no village services. He also was concerned that there is a 55 mile an hour in the village limits by his home. President Betcher will follow up with Gary Howell at Lapeer County Road Commission to discuss the concerns.

# **B.** Water/Sewer User Fee:

# C. Greg Antonelli – Closing of Public Sidewalk:

Greg Antonelli asked for council's permission to close the public sidewalk for 4 to 6 weeks to remodel his building located at 5502 Main Street. Council discussed alternate routes for the school children to cross the street after school starts. President Betcher will talk to Dryden Elementary School Principal Mr. Downey to discuss an alternate route for the children.
