The Season of Pentecost

But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

-Matthew 6:33

In 1971, after a Bible study/prayer meeting Karen Lafferty wrote a Christian worship song based on Matthew 6:33, Matthew 7:7 and Matthew 4:4. The hymn was published and copywritten in 1972 by Maranatha! Music. "Seek Ye First the Kingdom of God" is #783 in <u>With</u> <u>One Voice</u>, the blue paperback hymnal in our racks.

Seek! Seek ye first! Not as an afterthought, not as something to do when I have more time, not something to be totally ignored, but first... the first thing we should turn to every day, and not put out of our minds. What is it that we should be seeking? The kingdom of God. Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be added unto you.

What are the things that you will be given when you first seek God's kingdom? According to Matthew 6 beverage, food, and clothes, all things that are necessary for survival. And even though we sometimes fail to realize this, we need relationships to survive. Relationships can be difficult, they take work on both sides of the relationship, but they are essential to live a healthy life.

Although the world may not acknowledge it, as Christians the most important relationship for us is the one that we have with our Triune God, God the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. It is the thing we should strive to put first in our lives. Seek the relationship as though your life depends on it, because it does. Prayer, a conversation with God is the best way to build a relationship with God. A conversation is two-sided, that means you need a time of silence to hear God's reply.

Are you seeking God with a passion? Are you looking for God's kingdom on earth? In the 1977 movie "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" the main characters were consumed with the desire to create sculptures of something they didn't understand. Eventually they find it is Devil's Tower, in Wyoming, a tower of igneous rock believed to be the petrified volcanic eruption left after the mountain soil washed away that they are consumed with duplicating. This may be a bit of hyperbole (Jesus used hyperboles in his speech) but searching for God's kingdom is something that should consume us. It is something we should pursue until we make it our own, find it our home!

DID YOU KNOW?



"Photo Courtesy Paul Lorei" Michael shares that Sierra Griffith is the first person from our region to be accepted to the School of American Ballet (SAB), since the 1980s.

Michael Patterson who has been a Lector and reader for us prior to the pandemic and in his career life is the Artistic Director of the Patterson School of Ballet, which was founded in August of 2014. Michael's training began locally with the late Sharon Filone who fostered his love of the art form and nurtured his talents. His training continued at the Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet in Carlisle, PA under the watchful eye of world renown teacher Marcia Dale Weary. While at CPYB, Michael received an invitation to join the Pennsylvania Ballet, which is the sister company of the New York City Ballet. There he had many opportunities to perform a variety of works ranging from the rigorous classical to the neoclassical and modern works. He has had many ballets created for him including the work Cellophane, created for him by Brian Sanders, which was featured in the benefit performance, Shut Up & Dance. While a member of Pennsylvania Ballet Mr. Patterson had the opportunity to work with and perform Christopher Wheeldon's groundbreaking version of Swan Lake at the Edinburgh International Arts Festival in collaboration with the Tchaikovsky Symphony Orchestra of Moscow Radio where the Lord Provost honored them.

Throughout his career, Michael has had many opportunities to grow and learn from his professional colleagues in the field and has made it his mission to enrich children's lives and provide opportunities for personal growth and achievement by utilizing the skills developed in the studio. Students of his have danced with or are currently dancing with Joffrey Ballet, Washington Ballet, American Repertory Ballet, Minnesota Ballet, Sarasota Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, Orlando Ballet, Pennsylvania Ballet, Boston Ballet, and Netherlands Dans Theater. Recently, one of his students was invited to the year-round program at the School of American Ballet (SAB) the nation's preeminent ballet school, which is located in Lincoln Center, NYC. Michael Patterson's students regularly perform throughout the community helping organizations such as the Festival of Trees raise money for the Children's Miracle Network, JaDE Benefit which benefits the Special Olympics of Crawford County. Additionally, the Patterson School of Ballet helps to create opportunities for children to experience the arts at the Barber National Institute, the ExpERIEnce Children's Museum, as well as many other local organizations. Programs offered are for ages 3 and Up.

Michael Patterson has been attending Immanuel since 2017 and is the husband of Immanuel's long-time organist Bryan Timm.

We have all heard and seen the devastating environmental events that are happening around the globe. Extreme heat, wild fires and drought in the West, horrible flooding in Europe, frequent, intense thunderstorms right here. We are called upon to **be the good stewards of our home that God expects** us to be. Individual actions won't be enough to stop our environmental crisis, but **your actions can be a catalyst**

for change. Every dollar you spend (or don't), every contact you make (or don't) with policymakers, every conversation with family, friends, or colleagues sends a message to the market, to the legislature, to others about their actions. Be faithful in your creation justice efforts.

You can **lead by example**, by your actions and your words showing family, friends, fellow congregation members, co-workers, and even strangers what is important and how they too can take action for good.

When you talk about creation care, don't double down on statistics or guilt. Live what you value. **What you make a practice speaks volumes to others.** If you recycle, if you choose durable over single-use plastic, if you consistently avoid food waste or compost it, if you plant trees or native plants for pollinators, and so on, people notice, and people ask. Then you can share why you do it and the benefits you experience. And people listen.

Numerous climate justice organizations are doing excellent work. Explore them to continue to **educate yourself**. You may also choose to **sign advocacy petitions,** which will be sent to appropriate policy makers, or to support their work financially, knowing that *you*—through these groups—will continue to make a positive difference. **Support their work also with your prayers.**
