HALLELUJAH! CHRIST AROSE!

As I was driving from our home to the Report office, the words of the familiar Easter hymn began going through my mind — "Up from the grave He arose, with a mighty triumph oe'r His foes; He arose a Victor from the dark domain and He lives forever with His saints to reign, He arose! He arose! Hallelujah! Christ arose!" As I thought on this song the Lord brought to my remembrance the first time that I ever heard these words.

In 1954 I was living in Sasebo Japan, with my parents. A good friend of mine was the daughter of the chaplain of the Army post and so I began to attend church with her. As Easter approached the choir began to practising for the special services and since my friend was in the choir I decided that I'd like to join the choir also. We spent a lot of time preparing and learning the songs that were to be used and this beautiful hymn "Christ Arose" was one of them. I loved the song from the first I heard it and enjoyed singing with the choir. Easter Sunday came and many people gathered for services that morning. The choir sang the hymns and the chaplain brought the message. I don't even remember what he spoke on but I shall never forget what followed. Since it was Easter, communion was going to be taken. I didn't know anything much about this ordinance but as he opened this part of the service, I felt that I would like to partake of it. I wasn't a Christian - never heard of the "Full Gospel". I had heard that you should be a member of a church to take communion anyway. As I went to the front with the other members of the choir I felt real shaky, but as I knelt something happened that had never happened before. It seemed as though I was kneeling in the very presence of God. I felt like I was standing on Holy ground, a place I'd never been before. And I still believe I was. I didn't become a Christian that day - no one had ever told me about repentance - but that sacred visitation of God never left me. In fact it was several years before I heard the gospel preached but during those years God gently opened doors and tenderly spoke to my heart. So at this Easter time of 1994 my heart rejoices and remembers when God in all His love and mercy made me aware of His Presence and that not only did Christ die for me but that "Christ Arose" for me as well.

May all praise, honour, and glory be given unto Him.

ARTICLE VII
Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Creation and Formation.

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation.

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers

Do not condone divorce and remarriage, Matt. 19:8-9.

Destruction of the Wicked. Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

HE IS NOT HERE: FOR HE IS RISEN

How absured it is not to believe in Jesus. How impossible to doubt each of His precious promises. How pagan not to accept as Scriptual fact His resurrection. Too much emphasis cannot be placed upon the resurrection. The Christian world will meet in grand array on this Easter to depict the resurrection from the place where it is supposed that He lay near Jerusalem to the far flung islands, and even in many heathen lands missionaries will do their best to stress the resurrection.

THE PROOF OF HIS RESURRECTION


Why should I try to prove His coming forth from the tomb? Would it not be better for you to prove that He did not come forth? The only evidence that a disbeliever has is the old one time lie as told by the fearful soldiers who were sent to guard the tomb, lest He be stolen away. Some answer had to be given and they could not explain His disappearance, with out acknowledging His resurrection, the one thing that the world of His day hated to admit the most. In proof we do have the Bible account. Would you want to deny the very core of the Bible—the Divine acclamation of the Father, and Son and Holy Ghost?

Do you want to destroy any and every thread of history, doubting any and every report of all races, and religions (that believe in Christ and His resurrection, and who would want or endorse any other?) Do you want to forget every picture, every work of art—calling it all a model of ignorance and superstition? Do you desire to by-pass every church and temple building and call them only halls of delusion? Should all the pens of wise minds and sincere hearts be put out of mind and every book closed forever—?

All of this and much more must be eradicated from thought and worship if Jesus was not resurrected.

THE IMPORTANCE OF HIS RESURRECTION

I think that some times it is difficult for people to realize that Jesus was the first fruit of the resurrection. Note the high points of I Cor. 15: 12-26. All our hope of living again after death lies in the power of His resurrection. Even Old Testament saints knew and testified of the resurrection. Job gives some of the most beautiful words of hope and confidence found in Job 14; 12-15. "... If a man die shall he live again? All the days of my appointed time will I wait, till my changes come. Thou shalt call, and I will answer thee:——". David knew that he would see the Lord in all of His



beauty, for he said, "I shall be satisfied, when I awake, in thy likeness" Psa. 17:15.

The Scribes and Pharisees were always seeking a sign of the Divinity of Christ, so Jesus gave them one, the only one—that is that Jesus Himself would come forth from the grave. Matt. 12:38-40. Mark 8:11-12. In this case, because they already had His world all Jesus could do was to breathe a sign of regret for the unbelieving world about Him. In Matt. 16: 1-4 Jesus plainly sets forth the knowledge of His coming resurrection. Read Like 11: 29-30. All doubt, all fear, all misgivings had to go with His resurrection.

I never read the account of the Emmaus brethren without a real heart warming thrill. Luke 24:13-35. The thought, did not our heart burn with is? and the Lord is risen indeed, should quell any anxiety, and route all false impressions. As for me the direct words of Jesus in one passage suffices. "I am the resurrection and the life; he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live". He continued. "And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this? John 11:25-36. Yes, I believe and know that He can keep that which I have committed unto Him, against that day. II Tim. 1:12.

THE GLORY OF HIS RESURRECTION

The glory of that sinless, sickless and deathless body is more than tongue or pen can describe; it is more than we can comprehend or valuate. "Now I only know in part, but some day we shall see Him as He is" I Cor. 13:12. I John 3:1-1. Think of the glory of that first Easter morn. Death was passed, suffering was over, and the price was paid for all humanity that they might live and reign with Christ. Rev. 1:5, Rev. 5:10, Rev. 20:6-7.


groups prayed in the the early morning.

THE DEPARTURE, THE DELUSION, THE DISAPPOINTMENT

Often, by the Enlightening Power of God, a verse will seem to demand "You have read me many times, but this time Pay Attention!" So it was with the account in Judges the thirteenth chapter.

The condition God made before Samson's birth stated that he would drink no strong drink. not eat any unclean thing and that no razor would come upon his head; requirements that, if kept, would show Samson's willingness to comply with God's purpose of his being used as a military leader to deliver Israel. Now, Samson grew and was blessed by God, at times. At times, Samson would be moved mightily by the Spirit (14:6-the renting of a young lion, 19-the slaying of 30 men), but what about the other times? What about the times when Samson wasn't moved by the spirit of the Lord. What moved him then? Was it not the lust of the flesh; the desire to do as he pleased? Chapter 14:1 records 'Samson went down...and saw a woman..: 16-Samson...saw there an harlot, and went in unto her. Did not Samson move within his own might when not moved by the Spirit of God? One might wonder why God would use a man like Samson, whose life was filled with such contrast.

In Chapter 16:3, it's recorded the story of love betrayed and the influence of evil associations. Delilah, whom Samson loved, is said to have been bought herself for filthy lucre. The design of the conspiracy was to discover 'wherein his great strength lieth.' Samson's 'Thorn in the flesh' persisted beyond three times, trying to get Samson to reveal his 'secret'. Three times she sought and was eluded, but CONSTANCY pays off (literally for her).

Finally, after she pressed him daily with her words '..that he told her all his heart ... and if I be shave, then my strength will go from me.' As before, Delilah alerted Samson, for he was asleep. "Arise, thou that sleepest (and Christ shall give thee light-Eph. 5:14)." the thing you have not feared is come upon thee. Now, wait a minute as Chapter 16:20 is read. Samson awoke out of his sleep, and said "I will go out as at other times before and shake myself." Here is the delusionthat he was going to continue living, acting, talking, as he always had, regardless of how he lived, acted, and spoke in view of his relationship with God. This time there was something drastically different-the Departure. True, the Philistines were there as before, and Delilah had again put forth her effort in earning her money, but Samson 'wist not' (knew not, did not perceive) that the Lord had departed.

Samson, rather forcefully, was 'enlightened' to the fact that his strength, indeed,m was gone.

Here comes the Disappointment - many times while in the possession of his captors, it is probable that Samson wished that he hadn't given in to the persistent pleasure of Delilah or that he had discovered the conspiracy (but, alas, wishing things hadn't been is always futile).

As Samson did 'grind in the prison house,' there was time to consider his ways. Defeated, blind, groping, Samson realized that the strength did not 'lie' within him any longer and once again asked "O God, remember me, I pray thee, and strengthened me...only this once.." 16:20. When the Philistines called for Samson to make sport of him, Samson took hold of the two middle pillars...and he bowed himself with all his might; and the house fell.." (29,30). The Bible says that more people died at his death that all those which he slew in his life. "And he judged Israel twenty years."

So good did come out of this, but at what cost? It resulted in the death of a man of almost confusing contrasts; a man who was separated as a Nazarite, yet tampered with evil associates; a man who, as a child, was blessed by the Lord and had the Spirit beginning to move within his life, only to finish without that same Spirit continuing to move. History might have been different at this time had Samson kept his vow and his hair, but whatever is past will be, and we must learn from it.

I have stated that Samson's life was filled with almost confusing contrasts, for we may have wondered why Samson seemed so unstable in some of his ways, or how could God use someone that was 'double minded?' Before we become too critical of Samson, couldn't we ask the same about other Christians today (or even ourselves?) do not many Christian people live a life of contrasts; people wanting to do good, but falling short much of the time? Do not many people have the Spirit of the Lord begin to move in their lives, enabling them to do mightily for the Lord, yet at the times when the Spirit is not allowed to move, they move according to their own desires?

I've wondered at the actions and attitudes of many Christian people including especially myself. I've wondered how come we are (or seem) so spiritual at times, yet so 'unspiritual' at other times?

I've found that my problem is that I trust in the arm of flesh and leaning to my own understanding causes me to not move as I should. Delilah wanted to know the source of Samson's strength, and the compromising of his position cost him dearly. The Christian's strength of course comes from maintaining and improving our relationship with the 'God of all Sufficency. there have been, and are, too many Christians that have started well for the Lord, but have become involved in

compromising positions and with wicked company, resulting in their loss of strength. Then when the time arises that the strength of the Lord is needed (which is always), we arise to confront the situation and find that Help is not present. It's a shame that we continue in our wrongful ways, having been pressured by the worldly minded into finally relaxing our stand on the Lord's standards, then when we finally awake, suddenly there is no strength. I've also wondered if we have been deceived into believing that God is going to continue to work in our lives even when we're not working for Him? Do we expect Him to be 'a very present help in trouble' even when we're 'afar off?'

Dearly beloved, wherein does your strength lie today? Is it within yourself or others? Perhaps you've placed your trust in your past works, and are expecting them to carry you. The past mercies of God are to assist in helping our faith to be increased for this present time, but not to be depended on as security, expecting Him to perform in us if we are not performing for Him. It comes down to how to perform that which is good I find

I rejoice in what I have been able to do for the Lord, but the important question is 'what am I doing for Him now?' We ought to live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world instead of being pressured into letting down our guard. What a terrible and hopeless feeling it is to need the Lord, only to find Him departed while we slept! It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed. Great is His faithfulness. How about yours?


