FWD/Ford Event Info

RULES / NOTES

- FWD – Eligible cars must follow Race 8, Pro Compact, Factory FWD or similar rules. Safety is the #1 priority with mandatory items being roll cage, steel door plate, racing seat and racing belts.
- Ford – Eligible cars must follow rules set by the Speedrome or Sportsdrome for the 2019 season.
- Tech (all cars) – If your car is here for the first time in 2019, you will need to take the car through tech before going onto the track. Each car will go through the tech line before each feature.
- Tech (Ford) – After each feature, the top five finishers must go to tech.
- Transponders – Each car is required to have a transponder. Bring an ID to the parts barn at the pit entrance to get a transponder (no charge). Return your transponder after your last race or be fined. When pulling onto the track for a race, cross the start/finish line once before going to the starting grid.
- Yellow Flags – We race under the yellow flag. The yellow flag is an advisory of a minor situation on track such as a spun car or debris. If the situation needs further attention, the red flag will be waved.
- Prize Money – Checks will be available at the end of each night at the pit office front window. If you do not have a 2019 W-9 on file, please print one off Speedrome.com and bring to Scott in the garage.

THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 5TH

- FWD Figure 8 will have practice, heats, and a feature. Your best practice lap time will be considered your qualifying time. Heat race lineups will be half inverted with odd qualifiers in one heat and even in the other. The feature lineup will be straight up from the heat race finishes.
- The Ford division will have Oval practice, heats, and a feature as well as a Figure 8 feature. These are regular season races (open to anyone) and will be lined up by the regular season guidelines (available in the Ford section under Season Info on Speedrome.com).

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 6TH

- FWD Figure 8 will have practice, heats, and a feature. Your best practice lap time will be considered your qualifying time. Heat race lineups will be half inverted spread evenly across two or three heats (depending on car count). The feature lineup will be straight up from the heat race finishes.
- Ford Figure 8 will have practice, qualifications, “B” feature, and “A” feature. The top 18 qualifiers will advance directly to the “A” feature with the top 12 times being inverted. Qualifiers 19th thru the field will start straight up in the “B” feature. The top 6 finishers will advance to and start on the tail of the “A” feature.
