Research strongly supports the importance of continuing the practice of reading and math skills throughout the summer to avoid the "Summer Slide of Skills."

Stepping Stones Academy also strongly supports the continuation of these skills during the summer as it is obvious to teachers in August which children practiced reading and math in June and July and those who did not.



Calendars for June and July are provided to families so they may record the minutes practiced during these months. Students are encouraged to practice a minimum total of 500 minutes for June and July and turn in their calendars by the due date in August. (The due date will be announced on the first day of school in August.) Students turning in one or both calendars in August will receive a certificate and

Mrs. Panagopoulos and Ms. Stewart-Alliger will also provide a "surprise" for students turning in calendars. It remains a mystery as to what the "surprise" will be this August.


WET-N-WILD FIELD TRIP NEXT THURSDAY FOR 3RD-8TH GRADERS

On Thursday May 17th, the 3rd-8th graders will spend the day at Wet-n-Wild Water Park located at 43rd Avenue and Pinnacle Peak Road. The park opens early just for school groups.

Students need to wear school uniform, but may wear their swimming suits under their clothing. Students may also wear flip flops to school instead of shoes adhering to the uniform policy.

Parents are asked to review the following rules with their children to ensure everyone understands the expected guidelines:

- 1. Wristbands will be handed out the morning of the field trip and must be worn all day.
- 2. Individuals may not take food or beverage into the park except unopened, factory-sealed water bottles. Backpacks, purses, and all other bags will be searched before entering the park.
- 3. Students need to bring a towel and sunscreen. Students will apply sunscreen throughout the day unless they bring a note from home. Students may also bring a cap/visor and/or shirt to wear.
- 4. Students may wish to bring money to purchase items from the Snack Shop or rent tubes for the slides, but this is optional.
- 5. All other personal items, including cell phones, I-Pods, and handheld video games, are to be left in the School Office or at home.



- 7. Students are to have a buddy throughout the day. The buddy may be a classmate, friend from another class, or SSA adult. Buddies may change during the day.
- 8. Lunch will be eaten as an SSA group. The menu is hamburger, chips, and drink.
- 9. All items, such as backpacks and towels, may remain at the SSA camp area, but SSA and Wet-n-Wild are not responsible for lost or missing items.







As of last Thursday, May 3rd a new education budget was passed; however, schools are still determing how this specifically affects their budgets. Stepping Stones Academy anticipates additional funding for student attendance, but

the actual amount is not yet known. What other increased funding will be provided to schools is not yet clear, as many conflicting reports and numbers are being published. Stepping Stones Academy is waiting to hear from the AZ Department of Education and AZ State Board of Charter Schools before determining exact amounts and how this money is to be spent.
