Diversity Postdoctoral Fellowship in Cardiometabolic Disparities and Health Equity Promotion Research at SUNY Downstate

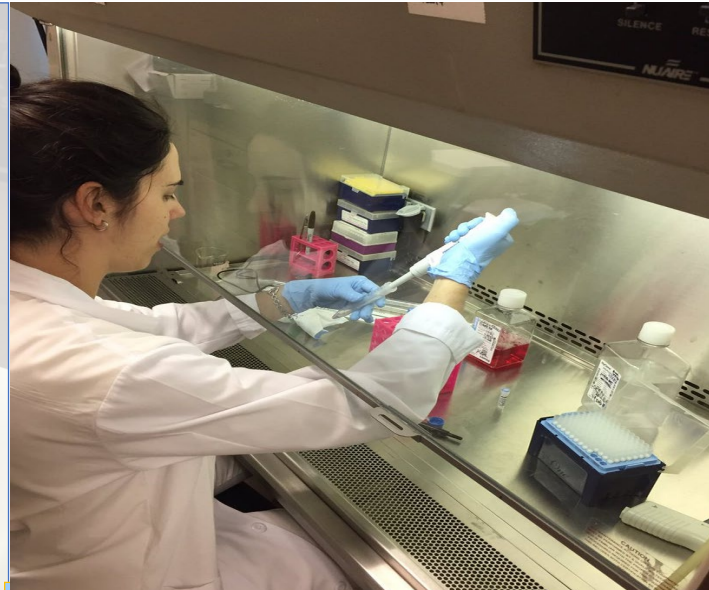
AN ENRICHING TRAINING PROGRAM that provides postdoctoral fellows with hands on and mentored-research activities while enhancing skills in research methodology. This program will prepare fellows for an independent research career that addresses cardiovascular health disparities and advances equity.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- Two Year Training Program 2022-2024
- Up to \$60,000 Salary Support per year
- Plus, up to \$20,000 for Research support, research training, and courses.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Underrepresented individuals in biomedical, clinical, behavioral, and social sciences. These groups include: Blacks or African Americans, Hispanics or Latinos, American Indians or Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders, Individuals with disabilities, Individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds, and women
- Applicants must hold a doctoral degree in the biomedical, nursing, allied health professions, behavioral or public health sciences (MD, PhD, PhD/MD, DNP, ScD, DrPH or equivalent). Recipients of independent research awards such as an R01 or program project are ineligible for this program. However, "K"-type awardees are eligible. Must be a US Citizen or Legal Resident .



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Structured research mentorship
- Networking opportunities with community and local government partners
- Transdisciplinary research focused on health disparities and equity
