### "Perseverance"

"Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials; knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." James 1:2-4

Researchers in recent years have been studying why some people are more resilient than others. An article in *AARP* magazine cited some of these studies. The article pointed out that resilient people share several qualities. These qualities have relevance to us because they support what the Bible says about how we Christians can persevere in the face of trials. The researchers found these qualities in resilient people:

- 1) They stay connected. The Bible says that we need to be involved in a church (Hebrews 10;23-25), and we need to give attention to genuine fellowship. Support in trials comes from being connected to the Body of Christ.
- 2) They're optimistic. The Biblical equivalent is hope. We Christians know that God is sovereign, and God is good. We can be confident that He has a plan for us that is ultimately good. Whatever happens to us, we know that we are going to heaven and that we can look forward to eternal rewards for faithfulness displayed in our earthly lives.
- 3) They're spiritual. The foundation of our lives is a vertical relationship with the God who is there. The cultivation of that relationship through a regular devotional life contributes to our ability to persevere in the face of trials.
- 4) They're playful. Duke University professor Al Siebert writes in *The Resiliency Advantage*, "Resilient people enjoy themselves like children do. They wonder about things, experiment, and laugh." Certainly that should also be true of members of the family of God.
- 5) They give back. We call it service. We follow the One who declared, "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."
- 6) They pick their battles. Harvard professor Robert Brooks writes in *The Power of Resilience*, "Resilient people tend to focus on things over which they have some influence and not spend time on things they can't control." The Bible teaches that we have certain responsibilities, but there are other things that are beyond our control and fall into the realm of God's sovereignty.
- 7) They stay healthy. Paul taught that our physical bodies are the temples of the Lord. (1 Corinthians 6:19) That implies a responsibility to maintain them properly.
- 8) They find the silver lining. That also relates to the doctrine of hope, and it ties in with the Biblical concept of learning from our mistakes.


