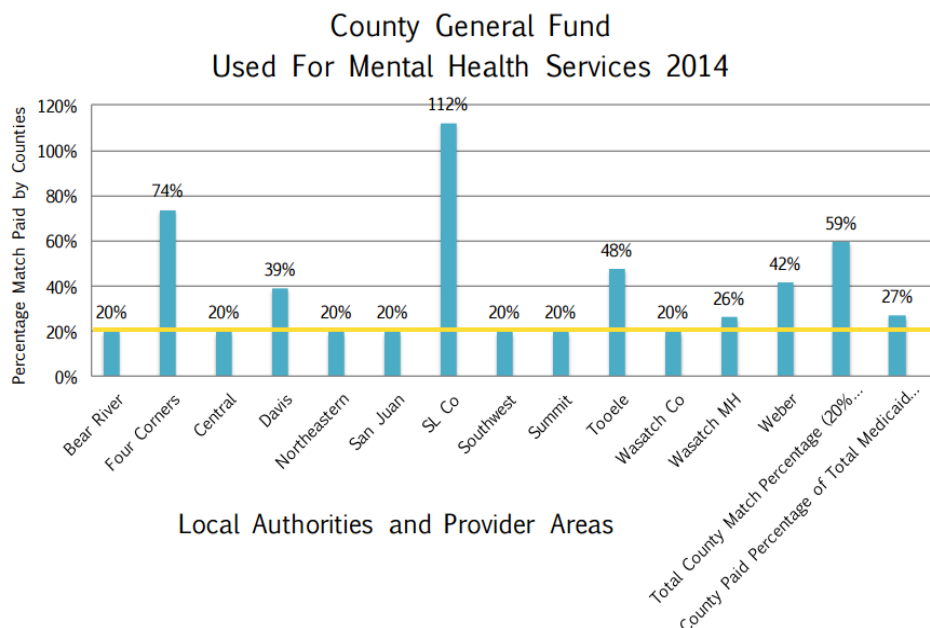


The Data Behind the \$6.4 M Ongoing & \$5 M Onetime Medicaid Match Request Serving the Current Medicaid Population



Though required to match SGF dollars at a rate of 20%, as seen in the graph to the left, Salt Lake County far exceeds this requirement.

Medicaid is a partnership between the State and Federal Government. In Utah, counties partner with the state to administer these services.

Loss of the \$6.4 M would result in an \$8.4 M reduction in services in Salt Lake County alone, for the currently eligible Medicaid population.

Due to continued enrollment growth since the original request in 2014, counties are requesting an additional \$5 M onetime dollars.

As seen in the graph to the right, there has been a substantial increase in Medicaid lives over the years (red), while SGF dollars (green) have remained fairly flat. Unlike the dollars allocated on the physical health side (blue) to the DOH, SGF dollars do not increase each year according to growth, for behavioral health services.
