

President Lilla Hewitt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Minutes – The minutes from the March 15th meeting were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report – Gloria presented the Treasurer's Report prepared by Linda Fairbanks, on file.

Old Business -

<u>March 11-12 – Festival of Driving, Arizona Driving & Carriage Society</u> – A thank-you letter was received from Peter Atonna on behalf of ADCS in appreciation of our sponsorship.

New Business -

<u>Club Jackets</u> – Kay suggested we consider getting matching club jackets with our official logo and presented samples from several catalogs. She is set up to do the embroidery for a nominal fee. Club members thought this would be a good idea and look very nice wearing these at club events. Several members stayed after the meeting to review the types and materials of jackets that would be suitable. This will be reported on at the next meeting.

<u>Driving Derby at Ann's</u> – This could be combined with a Buddy Buggy Days. A suggested date was July 2nd. The event will need a Coordinator.

<u>Cass Winery Drive</u> – Kay checked with the winery and reported that there would be a restriction of only 4 vehicles (truck and trailer combo) due to space constraints and that a drive would need to be scheduled during the week as they are booked on weekends. Attendees would have a choice of lunches at the venue. Kay and Gloria will visit the site to check on the terrain for driving and report back.

<u>Possible Meeting Day Change</u> – Due to the difficulty in reserving meeting rooms on Wednesdays, it was suggested we may want to go back to our Monday night meetings. It was felt we should stick with the third Wednesday of the month and check out other venues, i.e. Margie's Restaurant in SLO that has a meeting room.

Calendar of Club Events -

April 8 - Hats & Wildflowers Drive in Parkfield - was cancelled due to rain.

<u>April 25 for 6 weeks – Cones Course competition at Overlook</u> – Linda had distributed flyers and sign-up sheets for the proposed six-week cones practice event over a regulation course, with the course changing every week. Volunteers are needed every Monday to help set up the new course. It was noted that this is for BODS members only. Those interested in entering can join the club beforehand. Scores will be tallied and a special award given to the winner at the end of the six-week competition.

Lilla and Aleks reported we now have a club Facebook page and we will show this event on Facebook to spread the word and will also note other events and information about the club.

May 27-28 – Memorial Day Drive at Twin Rivers – Stephanie reported we would be setting up the course on May 27th and will drive on May 28th. She will check on the fee for Twin Rivers

<u>June 3 – Trailering clinic at Fairbanks' Overlook Driving Center</u> - A retired CHP officer and professional hauler will review state laws on trailering and ways to maneuver your trailer safely. Six to eight people can bring their rigs; anyone can attend. No fee will be charged by the clinician or Overlook; only our \$55/event insurance fee. We can provide a deli tray, bread and drinks for lunch at cost. A flyer and sign-up sheet will be posted in the newsletter.

<u>November – Turkey Trot Drive in Parkfield</u> – To be finalized later. Lilla commented, however, that any club member who would like to drive at Parkfield is welcome to do so anytime.

A Timed Obstacles practice series to be held on six consecutive weeks beginning Tuesday, April 25 and concluding on June 4. You may drive the course at your convenience any day of the week except Monday. To arrange your drive time, call or e-mail Linda at 805-237-8476, lkfairbanks@gmail.com. The location is Overlook Driving Center, in Paso Robles.

Bring your own assistant if you need one. Paddocks are available if you want to bring more than one horse or pony. Good warm-up area is available, but the course itself is closed until you are ready to drive it for time. You will be given a walkie-talkie to call for the timer/judge to come score your cones drive. You may drive the course again after your official go.

Courses may include water crossing and/or a bridge. Courses will use ADS regulations. A turnout consists of horse/pony, driver and carriage. Any change constitutes a new turnout. Registration fee is \$35.00 for the entire series for each turnout you enter. Make checks payable to Brass Oak Driving Society. Open to Brass Oak members only. You may join on the first day you drive the series, if necessary. Annual dues are \$35.00.
