January 5-11 K-6 Students learned about the polar bear's habitat. Then they had to plan and design an igloo. They could only use the materials on their design. The students will present their igloo and talk about the design process

January 12-15 K-6 students will plan and design a Snowball Catapult. We hope to use real snow to make our snowballs.

January 18 K-6 students will be practicing team collaboration using Digital Breakout Challenges. January 19-25 K-6 students will try to build the tallest snowman using stilts.

Miss Carla—Learning Center Academics: I hope everyone had a happy holiday. The students here at the center were great, it was a really a pleasant Christmas Break. I helped Ms. Denise with reading and did a writing activity on how to make a Grinch smile. Students came to my Math classroom for Math activities and games. We had a good time in the afternoons with Santa Claus, watching many Christmas movies, and playing Minute to Win it Games.

Each day, I have a story time with the addition of writing and counting objects with the kindergartners. The academic skills, I worked with the 2nd graders was writing and reading. We may use games, journals and books.

The 4th - 6th graders have continued to practice math skills at their grade level using Chrome books and worksheets.

Miss Denise—Learning Center Academics:

I hope everyone had a very nice holiday with their family! In the learning center for the month of December and Christmas break, we did several literature books to celebrate the holidays. Some of the books I read were Mooseltoe, Snowmen at Night, Snow Day for Mouse, Memoirs of an Elf, That's Good, That's Bad on Santa's Journey, How the Grinch Stole Christmas, Santa's Stuck, The Year Without a Santa Claus, and The Elves and the Shoemakers. Daily activities were then incorporated around the story shared. Some of these included large elf glyphs, cut-out Santas, construct a snowman, made Grinches and wrote how I would make the Grinch grin. We practiced writing with themes of if I were an elf, if I were a snowman at night, and if I had a pet reindeer, and several other skills reinforced using the book read. Each day was fun discussing the story and doing the many activities planned around the holiday thematic unit!

As far as tutoring groups on our regular school days we continue to keep plenty busy. The 1st grade has mastered their second quarter sight words, continues to work on classroom homework packets, word families, read orally with a partner, and basic addition skills.

The 3rd grade continues their 20 minutes for reading logs and weekly spelling words. We are working on telling time on clocks and multiplication facts. Grades 4th-6th are reading 20 minutes a day and in math working on multiplication, money and calendars such as days and months of the year. All groups are writing more and their work has been displayed around the center for the holidays. We had a white snowman tree in our room and our large elf glyphs displayed for the month of December. Now on to this next year 2021 and lots of new things to come!!
