


HAPPY NEW YEAR LAKESHARKS AND FRIENDS!



Eight of the bags went to Ridge Area Arc - serving and advocating for individuals with development and other disabilities. Two went to individuals needing a little extra love this year. The bag contained 25 numbered gifts to be opened each day leading up to Christmas. Best comment from a recipient: "I am like a kid in a candy store and can't wait for my next surprise. It made my bleak day so much brighter. Thank you from the bottom of my heart." We were able to purchase toys for all 75 of the children at RCMA in Lake Placid. They are incredibly grateful to our club and for some this may be their only present. Like last year, we committed to sponsoring four families through the Highlands County School system. Last year 8 children and this year 14!! We are extremely thankful for club members that stepped up and sponsored 8 specific children and to all our other members that gave ever so generously that we were able to furnish presents (toys, clothing, housewares and food) for the rest including their parents and a Publix family Christmas dinner certificate. 
