IN OVER OUR HEADS!

Several years ago, I led a mission trip to the mountains of West Virginia. While there, I took the group white water rafting on the New River. Once you are assigned to a boat, one of the first things they teach you is how to pull someone BACK in the boat. (People tend to fall OUT of those things!) You plant your feet, grab them by the lapels of their life jacket...and sit down! Your backward motion pulls them into the boat. Good to know!

During the trip, we hit a spot in the river where the water was both slow and deep. Our boat's guide encouraged us to get out and swim. OK- I can do that. I slipped over the edge of the boat and into the waters of the New River. The water felt good, but something became apparent really quickly- I couldn't get BACK in the boat! I was riding low enough in the water and the EMPTY boat was riding high enough in the water that I could NOT get in! I tried a few different approaches. Nope! I was in over my head! There was only one alternative available- swallow my pride and confess to the young woman (who could NOT have weighed more than 100 pounds!) who was our guide that I needed help! I did...she did...and soon I was back in the boat!

Being in over your head can be a scary thing. And I would like to state, categorically, that we- The Aledo United Methodist Church- are in over our collective head! We couldn't get BACK in the boat now if we tried! We have stepped out into DEEP water! And that can be pretty disconcerting!

But you know what? We have someone on our side who is a LOT stronger than a 100-pound rafting guide! We have Jesus Christ. He has called us to step out in faith. He entrusted us with a little..and we have been faithful. And so, now...He untrusts us with more. We have, as of this printing, brought in 31 new members thus far this year, performed 18 baptisms, added another worship service, and seen more and more visitors every week. This is the FIRST time in my 20 years of ministry that a church I am serving is this financially stable at this point in the calendar year. All of this is nothing short of amazing! And all of it is because we are in over our heads, trusting that Jesus will NOT let us sink but instead empower us to walk on water!

Do I know for sure what He has in store for us next? Nope! But I DO know that we were created AND brought together for just such a time as this. And I, for one, can't WAIT to see what He has in store for us next! God

CURRENT/NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, August 21, we started a new sermon series- Doing a 180. How many times have you realized that the direction you were headed was not the right one...but you weren't sure which way WAS the right one? In this short, 3-week series, we've look at Mary Magdalene- one of the greatest transformation stories in the Bible- and see what she has to tell us about turning our lives around for Jesus Christ. The final week of the series look like this:

Sunday, September 4- Be Patient (Mark 16:1-3)

Patience may be bitter, but its fruit is sweet.

(Isaiah 40:29-31, Romans 8:23b-25)

Then, on Sunday, September 11th, we begin a brand new day! Along with the official launch of the new 9:15AM worship service, we also start a new sermon series- Living A Red Letter Life. In certain printings of the Bible, the words actually spoken by Jesus are printed in red- The Red Letter Edition. His words are powerful and life-changing. What if we intentionally built our lives around those red letter sayings? Each week of this 5-week series will focus on just that- what DID Jesus say and HOW does it apply to us? The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, September 11- Faith Moves Mountains! (Matthew 17:14-20)

We are twice armed if we fight with faith.

(Psalm 37:4-6, Hebrews 11:1-3)

Sunday, September 18- Reconcile Your Brother! (Matthew 5:21-24)

The pattern of the prodigal is: rebellion, ruin, repentance, reconciliation, restoration. (Isaiah 1:18-19, 2Corinthians 5:16-18)

Sunday, September 25- Light the Darkness! (Matthew 5:13-16)

Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that.

(Psalm 139:11-12, John 1:1-5)

Sunday, October 2- God Values Children! (Matthew 19:13-15)

Be willing to sacrifice today so that your children can have a better tomorrow. (Proverbs 22:6, Matthew 18:1-5)

Sunday, October 9- Are You Ready? (Matthew 24:36-44)

Miracles come in moments- be ready and willing. (Proverbs 20:4-5, John 16:33)


ROCK AND WORSHIP




Wednesday Night Fellowship Is Here!

Labor Day

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. The first proposal of the holiday described it as a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations," followed by a festival for the workers and their families. In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations and on June 28, 1894, Congress made it a federal holiday. It originated as a "day off for the working citizens" and now is celebrated by most Americans as the symbolic end of summer. In addition, Labor Day marks the beginning of the NFL and college football seasons. The NCAA usually plays their first games the week before Labor Day, with the NFL traditionally playing their first game the Thursday following Labor Day. Celebrate the working men and women of our country on Monday the 7th!
