Pastor's thoughts....

Siblings in Christ, Recently the reading of Deuteronomy 4:8-9 was a part of our lectionary readings.

"<sup>8</sup>And what other great nation has statutes and ordinances as just as this entire law that I am setting before you today? <sup>9</sup>But take care and watch yourselves closely, so as neither to forget the things that your eyes have seen nor to let them slip from your mind all the days of your life; <u>make them known to your children and</u> your children's children."

Like many of you, I worry about my children. I do understand that scripture tells us not to worry, however, it is one our human frailties. It's one of the major job descriptions of parents to be concerned about the wellbeing of children. Even those who did not raise children, have a genuine concern for the children of our world and recognize the importance of faith and service.

Will our children cherish and pass on the faith and traditions dear to us? It seems this has been going on for thousands of years. Moses also worries about his children, the children of Israel as they prepare to enter the promised land. Will they remember and cherish the great gift of wisdom that God has entrusted to them? Will they appreciate one of the richest treasures in Scripture, the laws? 
#### July Finance Report

# 2022 ELCA Youth Gathering July 24-28, 2022



#### **ELCA Youth Gathering Overview**

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.

An important part of the Gathering's ministry are the two pre-events, the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE), a faith formation and leadership development event primarily for youth of color, and the table, a gathering that brings together, blesses and empowers youth with disabilities.

Youth who are in 8th to 12th grade at the time of registration (Fall 2021) are eligible to attend. If you are interested, please let Pastor Terrie know so we can begin applying for a grant to cover the cost of the gathering.

### Council Highlights from the August Church Council Meeting

**Treasurer's Report**: PPE loan for this year is currently in checking but we will move to savings in case it needs to be repaid. Terry provided a motion to approve July Treasurer's report, Kent provided a second, motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** The highlight since our last meeting was the ordination and installation of Michelle Knight to St. John's Pearl City. St. Mark's was well represented. I continue to get all students confirmed and some baptized. I am planning meetings and preparing for the fall education. I have visited nearly all shut ins in facilities. I will now focus on homebound people. I am presiding at the private graveside service for Lynn Quackboerner (Lisa Hinrichs father) on Friday. We have had a lot of surgeries, procedures, and treatments among our members and so far, most all are recovering very well. Next week I will finish teaching the 5- week Diakonia class "The Daily Life of a Christian". This is the final class for Merla Brooks and Tracey Anders after 2-3 years of dedication and expense they will graduate October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

**Worship Plans:** This Sunday we will resume bringing the congregation forward for communion using individual cups from the tray. They may continue to use individual kits at their discretion. Worship and music meeting is planned for early September. Cheryl and I selected hymns through the summer.

**Hospitality**: Will meet in the fall. Ed and Karen Olsen are moving to Medford, Oregon September 15<sup>th</sup>, Merla will contact them to confirm a date so we can have a social time event.

**Education**: I continue working with the confirmation class individually. Our constitution asks council to approve confirmation students. Kent made a motion to approve Ellia Escobar, Carter Merdian on August 15th and Zoie Wyatt on August 22nd for confirmation, Merla seconded, motion approved. Adult Bible Study will begin September 5<sup>th</sup> and Kent Anders will lead. Children's Sunday school begins September 12<sup>th</sup>. **Global Mission**: The shoe drive was very successful with over 65 pair being collected and they will be received in Romania in October. This group will begin to meet in the fall.

Thank you, Kent, and Merla for taking care of the weeds.

Old Business: We need help selling tickets for the market.
