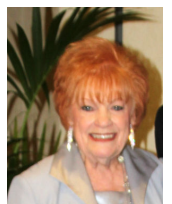

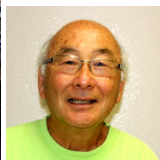

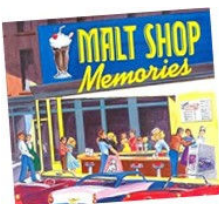

Dear Rail Dusters & Trail Dusters,

We continue to have wonderful pre-class dinners together and share some great times before dancing each Wednesday. In February we will try out several new restaurants, the Old New York Deli and Baja Fresh. Hopefully they will be enjoyable for everyone. Usually we have about 35 people meeting at 5:30. A reminder - the restaurants give us 15%, so it's an excellent way to raise money for our club. We also ask that you **leave a gratuity** since the servers work hard to please us.

I want to share some information I found recently about the Los Angeles landmark restaurant, The Pantry or **The Original Pantry Cafe**. This famous establishment was opened in 1924, serving breakfast all day - 365 days a year and 24 hours a day. Until 2011, (87 years) they served **free coffee**. It is owned by former LA mayor Richard Riordan and serves classic American fare - an "iconic diner proudly reflected in the

shop's prevailing throwback spirit." Most often you will find people lined up outside. It is an official LA Historic Cultural Monument. A reminder, they are **CASH ONLY**.

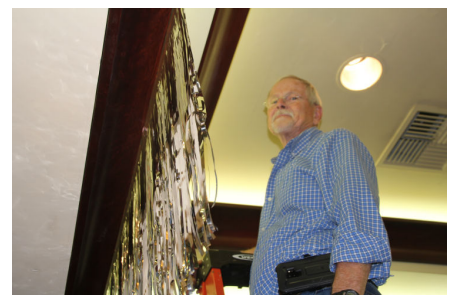

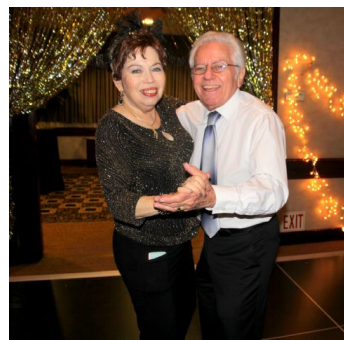

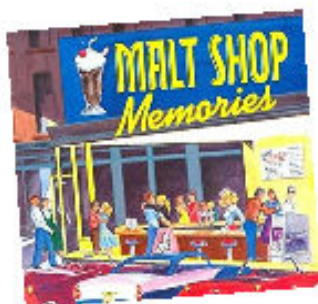
