## Recruiting in the SCA from LARP and reenactment communities By Baronet Hamish de Nisbet. OP

With having a winter fighting practice site that also hosts LARP (Live Action Role Playing) groups, I thought I would write an article to provide people with more information about how these groups differ from ours, and, more importantly, about their similarities.

Let's start with a sliding scale. We'll make 1 the very hard core reenactors, such as Civil War groups, where not only does your clothing have to be the right style for the era, so does the material you made it out of, the accessories, the weapons you carry, and how you carry them. There are many SCA members that strive for this level. The majority of us do not. Now, on the opposite end, a 10 is a backyard game where you shoot each other with foam darts. The reason I use this as my anchor is that it is pretty minimal involvement, low cost, and still fun. Most of us know people or have seen people at events who are doing the bare minimum. What the whole scale has in common is pretending to be someone else or do things that are not part of our daily life. So while there are SCA members that hit both ends of the scale, the majority falls firmly in the middle.

There are several types of "games" that fall into that scale. LARP's, Battle Games, Cosplay, Mil-Sim, Air soft, live steel and even Improv Theater. The settings cover everything from Fantasy novels, to Steam Punk, to some with a very specific time and place.... And sometimes that is even the Current time and place, occasionally with large alterations.

Every group comes up with rule sets based on what is important to them. Lots of groups use foam weapons as they tend to be lower cost and easier to train people to fight safely with a minimum of

protective equipment. We have all heard the jokes about "that's what we let our kids fight with" or "they fight with foam because they can't hack fighting with real weapons", etc. Having done activities with multiple groups, I can tell you a good fighter understands timing, distance and accuracy across all games. There are many SCA folks who grew up fighting other systems that are now dukes, viscounts, masters at arms, and knights. Lots of people play multiple systems, games, etc. as they receive something unique from each that they do not find particularly anywhere else. For every joke that SCA folks make about other groups, there are two more about us.

Some of the common ground that we can build on is based on shared experiences. Most of us spend a lot of time, money, and effort on our chosen endeavors. It does not matter if it's sewing 14<sup>th</sup> century garb or casting an orc mask, perfecting a defense from the I.33 or learning a j shot, singing a filk or performing a comedia del arte play. Fighter types spend time working on their movement and timing. Performers practice their delivery; Artisans continually make things. I have met Larpers who make garb that is on par with garb laurels. I have met reenactors who could document the mead they served, down to a specific town in a specific year.... and it was undrinkable. We all have our own "geeks" as to what excites us. When you talk to people in the reenacting communities, the SCA is often looked down on for our games of stick tag, our lack of appearance standards, and having "too large of a scope". When speaking to LARP groups, a lot of what you hear is that it's too expensive, too exclusive, and too difficult to get involved. When given a choice between two organizations, most people will chose the one they know better, whether it fits their needs or not. So making it less about "US VS THEM" and more about "hey, here is some stuff we offer, we would love to see you" is the path that may open up a new Known World to someone

A good friend (who started as a battle gamer) and I traveled to an event 20+ hours of driving away. He talked about their groups, even that it is held on

the same site as Pennsic. He talked about the "magic moments". He talked about putting 10 lbs. of equipment in a 5 lb. car, the letdown after an event, the disappointment when someone made a promise and let him down, the glory of standing shoulder to shoulder with his kinsmen. We made the same movie reference, bad jokes about video games, talked of and consumed good food and good beer. That event he and I defended a made up prince, of another made up kingdom, at a fake fort, at a made up war, with fake weapons while wearing fake armor, under made up names. His made up princess honored us with made up recognition. The real parts were the sweat, the friendship, the satisfaction at the end of the day knowing that, for a while, we knew what it was to be big damn heroes.... Well, sort of. That we used rattan rather than foam does not matter; that we had a tank rather than a dragon does not matter; that we had archers rather than wizards does not matter. What mattered is on the trip home, when the truck door closed..... The first words out of his mouth were, "no shit, there I was...."
