## The Best Ever Quilt Challenge!







We had a great turn out for the Brunch and Quilt Challenge Reveal. Approximately 30 of our Quilters have signed up to do the Challenge! Amazing!

The Challenge paired a Quilter with a Fat Quarter and a book from the Guild's Library for their inspiration. The books were chosen randomly and without looking so it was truly a mystery. Isn't the fabric lovely?



Hopefully you got a book that inspires you to learn a new technique and challenges your creativity. Projects - which can be any size - must be finished and quilted, and presented at the June 13<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting. We hope you have fun with your project!

## Applique!

There are different methods of applique. Here are the most common:

## Fusible / Raw Edge Applique

Fusible applique uses fusible web, such as Steam A Seam, that you draw your design on, adhere it to fabric then cut out and iron your design onto your quilt. You can finish it off by sewing around the edges of your design, utilizing various stitches such as a blanket stitch, zigzag or satin stitch.



## Freezer Paper Appliqué

Freezer Paper appliqué is similar to the Fusible appliqué method. Draw your design onto freezer paper, cut it out and iron it to the wrong side of your fabric. If you'd like to turn your edges under, cut the fabric slightly larger than the freezer paper, then iron the edges over before removing the freezer paper. Gently remove the freezer paper and affix it to your quilt.

## Needle Turn Applique

Trace the shape you want onto freezer paper, and press the paper onto the right side of the fabric. Trace around the freezer paper with a water-soluble marking pen. This line becomes the edge of your fold.

Cut around the appliqué shapes, leaving about ¼-inch seam allowance, then baste the pieces onto the background fabric and sew around the edges, either by hand or machine.

## The Applique Foot

The applique foot is shorter than most for easier maneuvering around curves and corners when sewing applique pieces. They are usually made of clear plastic for easier viewing as you sew.

## Chicken & Ginger with Rice Soup



### Ingredients

8 cups of chicken broth 4 - 5 cups of cooked chicken meat, shredded or chopped 4 inch piece of fresh ginger root

4 teaspoons toasted sesame seeds 6 green onions Spices - 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 1 star anise pod, 1 cinnamon stick, 1-2 clove of garlic-chopped 4 cups cooked rice Cilantro chopped for garnish

#### Directions

- 1. Put the first 4 ingredients and the spice list in a slow cooker for 6 hours on low.
- 2. Scoop the cooked chicken and place in a bowl. Strain the broth to remove the whole spices.
- 3. Return to the slow cooker.
- 4. Add the chopped cilantro.
- 5. Serve over rice in a bowl.

Serve with an Asian salad, crusty bread and butter.


