#### How's the Harvest?

Jesus always made his teaching relevant and often illustrated his lesson with a story, such as farming. One day Jesus reminded



the disciples of the need for more "spiritual harvesters" by saying: "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field" (Matt. 9:37-38). Now, more than ever, we need workers who are willing to sow and harvest in spiritual fields. What stops us from reaching out to that person we know God is nudging us to reach?

Fear: I read a story in which a man shared that God was nudging him to reach out to a neighbor but fear kept him from making contact with him. It read: "I walked the same route a man in my neighborhood jogged. Eventually, he gave up running and began working out on gym equipment in his garage. I would see him lifting weights in his garage and wave, but the Holy Spirit nudged me to walk up his driveway and tell him about Jesus. I invented excuses: time constraints, invasion of his privacy, and not really knowing him. Sometimes, I even walked a different route, avoiding his house, and my guilt for not stopping. Then, one day when I passed the house, cars jammed the driveway and spilled into the street. I discovered the man was dead and I had allowed fear to keep me from acting in obedience to God's voice."

Feeling inadequate: Satan has a way of stealing our confidence and convincing us we're not smart enough. God gave Moses an assignment and he immediately reminded God he was inadequate. We have to rely on our faith in God to help us when we feel like we will step out and fail.

Invasion of privacy: One person wrote: "The world bombards us with the message that people have the right to diverse spiritual beliefs and we are wrong to force our message or risk offending by implying their beliefs aren't correct. But relaying your personal story about God at work in your life isn't forcing someone to accept Him. Your personal experience is your story and others may identify and come to know Christ because you were willing to tell it." Just share with someone how God is working in your life, or what helps you in your day to day spiritual journey.

Expecting another messenger: Jesus told us the laborers are few (Matt. 9:37). Perhaps that's because everyone thinks someone else is going to do the work of harvesting. The fact remains, there are way too few harvesters, and we could all do a little more to reach someone. If we all just try to harvest one, imagine what the harvest would be? Look around you. There are ripe fields awaiting harvest, maybe as close to you as your own child, coworker, neighbor, or friend. So roll up your sleeves, go to work, and enjoy a bountiful harvest.

Paul said, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16).
