The Sunday School is now looking toward Bethlehem and the amazing events that took place there as we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of God's son through the following activities this month:

Advent Wreath - Our Sunday School classes will be taking turns lighting the Advent wreath prior to the beginning of our 10:30 AM worship service during the 4 weeks of Advent.

Christmas Program and Potluck - We have also begun working on our Christmas program "Christ the Savior Is Born" that we will be sharing with the congregation during the 10:30 AM worship service on December 16th. Some parts have been given out to the children already and the rest will be given out on Sunday, December 2nd. Classes will be telling the Christmas story as only children can through narration, special music and reenacting the events that took place in Bethlehem on that first Christmas.

We pray that you have a blessed holiday season where the miracle of the manger brings joy and peace to all of you!



An Advent reflection.... on Genesis 3:23, 4:1, 8 Luke 2:4, 7 Luke 23:46

When preparing for Advent I often think of these passages and how Eve and Mary's circumstances were similar. Both women would give birth to a child in unfamiliar surroundings with only their husbands to comfort them.

Eve, as the first woman, had no mother or grandmother to guide her through the birth process, she had no sister or aunt to turn to with questions on what to expect.

Mary left her mother, grandmother, sisters, and aunts behind as she traveled with her husband to Bethlehem to register and be taxed. She too, would have no woman to guide her.

Eve, being banished from the beauty of the garden would give birth to her child in a harsh and unfamiliar environment outside of the garden.

Mary having traveled far from her home and family would give birth to her child in the harsh environment of a stable.

Both would be filled with an overwhelming joy as they held their newborn for the first time.

Eve and Mary would nurture, guide, and love their child into adulthood.

And then, both women would know the unspeakable pain in the death of their sons.

Two different women...two different times...each bound together by God who touched them differently but with the same loving care.
