Early Years Pupil Premium Statement

The Early Years Pupil Premium [EYPP] is additional funding that is allocated to nurseries to support children from low-income families. This includes families of looked after children, families whose children are eligible for free school meals and children from service families.

The allocation for 2018-1 is £302 per child.

We have 12 children in the nursery that are eligible for Pupil premium funding; this is 11% of the cohort of children.

As last year, it will be used to contribute to the salary of our teaching assistant team who works five days a week across the 3-4 year old setting. The teaching assistants support the children in receipt of the EY Pupil Premium and their work includes:

- Setting up small group interventions, targeting children in receipt of the EYPP to narrow any gaps between them and their peers.
- Developing resource provision so that it enhances and reflects children's interests, building on the setting's 'planning in the moment' approach.
- Covering Key Persons to enable them to work 1:1 or in small groups with children in their group.
- Trips to the local area and beyond
- Play partnering individually or in small groups

The money will also be used to contribute to trips and outings that enhance the curriculum we offer our children. There are frequent visits to key shops and services in the locality and with the sights and sounds of central London so close by, many opportunities to engage with the wider environment, develop life skills and foster a strong sense of citizenship. We have also purchased popular culture resources to support children's current specific interests.

Impact of the Early Years Pupil Premium, 2016-17

During the year 2017-18, the Early Years Pupil Premium contributed to the salary of our teaching assistant team. A number of projects targeting children in receipt of the EYPP these included;

- Individual play partnering
- Small language groups
- Paired language groups
- Trips in the local area

The benefits of these interventions are highlighted in the end of year attainment and progress data for pupils in receipt of the EYPP.
