The Trinity United Church of Christ, Elliston Church Council met on September 19th, 2016 at 7:00 pm. Amy Mathews, President called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. and Ken Gahler opened with prayer. Those in attendance were as follows: President – Amy Mathews, Vice President – Ed Gahler, Recording Secretary – Desirae McCloskey, Financial Secretary, Nyla Denman, Elders - Ken Gahler and Connie Gahler, Trustees – Doug Avery, Marty Hoeft, Steve Turnow and Dale Bodnar, Deacons – Dwayne Hoeft Pastor Kyle Timmons and Church secretary Rhonda

Mahaney was present as well.

Absent: Deacon – Jim Buhro

Reports:

Recording Secretary:

Meeting minutes from the council meeting on 8/8/2016 were read prior to the meeting. Motion to accept the minutes for the past meeting was made by Ken Gahler, 2^{nd} by Dwayne Hoeft. MC.

Secretary Report:

- Reminder to council to contact Bob Jensen for annual maintenance of the front doors. Ed Gahler will follow up with Mr. Jensen for next steps, if any.
- We have received our first check from community market for turning in our receipts. The individual ahead of this project wants the money raised to go into the A/C fund. Steve

Turnow made a motion to add a line item within the financial books for an A/C fund, with 2^{nd} by Dale Bodnar. MC

- A quote (of approximately \$1,000) was received for cleaning and re-waxing the following floors (gym, bathroom, kitchens (and restroom) and coat room. However, Pastor Kyle also has experience in cleaning floors; therefore, Kyle has stepped up to clean and re-wax the floors to save the church some money. He has asking for a couple volunteers to help him with this task.
- Annual 4-H Kick-Off Rhonda has been contacted to see if the annual kick-off meeting would be able to be held on January 28th at the church. Ed Gahler made a motion to host the 4-H kick off meeting to be held at the church, free of charge. 2nd by Marty Hoeft. MC.
- Oil candles are still being looked into, however, due to the expense; we will postpone having a decision made for a few months.

Financial Report:

• Financial information was reviewed for the prior month. Nyla Denman moved to accept the financial report. Dwayne Hoeft 2nd. MC.

Pastor Report:

Kyle wanted to bring forth the elevator issues that were recently worked on by himself, as well as other church members: The church was originally working with All-Pro Elevator to fix the elevator. However, due to the company delaying on assisting the church (including not having parts) and still not fixing the elevator, the church decided to contact other service provider to fix the elevator. A series of bills were received by the church, however, Kyle/other members are disputing some of the charges. - The church received two invoices from All-Pro Elevator Inc. in the amounts of \$840 (for trip charge and team labor) as well as of \$249.16 (for restocking fee). However, council is not satisfied with the charges received. Based off discussion held during council, Desirae McCloskey made a motion to only pay the trip charge of \$ 131.25 to All-Pro. 2nd by Doug Avery.

-A bill of \$5,820 was received by Toledo Elevator (which was the company that ended up fixing the elevator was received) and was then subtracted from the contingent fund to pay for the costs for the elevator, which has reduced the balance into a negative balance.

• One wedding, one baptism and one memorial service performed since the last meeting.

- Three weddings and one baptism are currently scheduled for the following month.
- Suggestion to move the garden food to another location, potentially outside, due to the amount of bugs that are currently in that area.
- Now that Fall has begun, church activities have started during the week:
 - Women's Bunco and a Verse every other Sunday at 6:30
 - Men's Monday Night Football every Monday night
 - Branching out and after church Sunday school
 - Children's choir
- Amend Kyle's vacation week to start on October 16th. The worship committee will then need help for the Sunday service and the Wednesday Re-Kindle service.
- Pastor Kyle is still looking into outdoor signage for the church (approximately \$135 apiece), which will replace the signs that are currently looking outdated. He is continuing to follow up.
- Still waiting to hear back from stain glass Window Company for further timing and details.
- Wanted to remind members of the following dates:
 - Antique roadshow rescheduled for November 13th

Committee Reports:

Worship – Currently working on the Wednesday and Sunday service while Kyle is out. Anyone looking to assist would be greatly appreciated and should see Jane Gahler.

Due to Rhonda's recent other job changes, she will be stepping down as the custodian. The church will be looking for a new custodian starting October 1^{st} – 15 hours a week at \$10 a hour.

Search Committee – November 8^{th} will be the next (and last) meeting at 6:30, with a dinner.

Youth Events – We want to have more events for the youth, therefore wanted to make everyone aware of the following events that are currently planned.

- October 23rd 4 pm -8 pm Boo Festival
- November 6th 4 pm -8 pm Youth Progressive Dinner

We will be asking for people to help and to volunteer your time to make these events memorable for our youth.

Trustees -

- Lights in the stairwell down to the basement, as well as the basement lights, need replaced.
- The basement wall is being looked into by the trustees, after the recent rainfall this seems to be a bigger issue than were originally expecting.
- Ed Gahler will be purchasing additional tables for the church, as some need to be replaced.

Parsonage Committee - Appraisal has been done and the committee has determined an as-is asking price of \$100k. The current tenants have accepted the appraisal of \$100k with the exception of the church replacing the roof prior to the sale. Therefore, estimates will be gathered on the roof cost prior to making any further decision.
