

## Bread of Life Series

August 8, 2021

John 6:41-51 & John 6:51-58

The Real Presence, is it really Real? In today's Gospel, the people denied the reality of Christ's words that he is Bread from heaven because they thought they knew him and where he came from. They were looking at external appearances rather than heavenly realities. We think we know what the Eucharist is because we have seen and tasted it; we have perceived it with our senses, which tell us it is not really flesh and blood. If what we perceive as real is only based upon a worldly and sensory knowledge, then we will miss Christ in our very midst because he is beyond our powers of physical perception, but this is knowledge that only comes through faith. God speaks in Sirach 4:17 saying, "I will walk with them in disguise" and he is still doing that today in the Eucharist. Jesus never leaves or abandons us. Jesus is here. Jesus is real. We can trust in his words when Jesus tells us that he is truly the Bread of Life come down from heaven, and that this Bread of Life did not leave us at the Ascension, but as he says, "behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Please continue to pray for all the parishes of our Diocese as we have two weeks left on the Bread of Life discourse.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What is a transitional deacon?

Answer:

There are two types of deacons in the church. Both are members of the clergy. Both have the same liturgical role. Both have the service of the community as their primary work. One is called a permanent deacon, usually a married man ordained as a deacon with no intention of becoming a priest. They preach, baptize, witness marriages, conduct funeral services, and look after the needs of the poor. They also visit the sick and take Communion to them, although they cannot celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. They might also assist the pastor in his administrative duties. Permanent deacons are usually well known and respected in their communities and have roots there.

A transitional deacon is one who functions as a deacon for a period of time prior to ordination as a priest. His diaconate assignment serves as a kind of internship of ordained ministry. During his year or two as a deacon, he will learn the practical aspects of parish life, getting a firsthand look at the life of a priest. His work has a different focus than a permanent deacon in that he is looking forward to ordination as a priest.

### INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say.
