St. Mary's Mission—Red Lake



A group of 6 teens and 2 adults from St. Cecilia's recently spent a week at the Mission on the Red Lake Reservation. Mission facts: More than 80% of babies on the Red Lake Reservation are born with a substance addiction due to maternal drug use. In addition to running the parish church (now temporarily housed in the school after last

December's church fire) and elementary school, the Mission supplies diapers and other resources to Red Lake families in need.

Here is a reflection by Kate O'Connell about her experiences at Red Lake.

I met a younger child this year, who hadn't been there in prior years. This boy came late the first day, standing by the door of the room where we were, uncertain about coming in. I welcomed him and asked for his name, which he quietly told me. After a little while, he took my hand, we went into the room and then spent the rest of that day together. He asked me if I would eat lunch with him. In fact, he often asked questions – will you come with me? Will you read this to me? Will you chase me?

While it was clear that he had some developmental issues, he was delightful, enjoying life, smiling his beautiful smile. It was a pleasure to be with him and see the world through his joyful eyes. I also saw that he was easily influenced by other children, as he took joy in their running around, even in the school, where they are supposed to walk, and in not always following directions.

I shared with our group that I was sad for this boy and worried about his future. But our insightful young people had hope for this child – they said they could easily see him growing up, dealing with his life, and becoming an advocate for children who face the challenges he faces.

And I believed them. After all, we had spent Monday evening with a young Red Lake man who several years ago had serious brain injuries and wasn't expected to live – this young man finished his Associates Degree and will continue his education at Bemidji State University, so he can teach students at Red Lake.

On the last day, when I told this little boy that I would be going back to St. Paul, he asked me, "How many more days before you come back?" I will hold this child in my heart until then.
