EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CERVICAL CANCER



4th most common cancer in people with a cervix



Curable when diagnosed and treated promptly



Almost all cases are linked to infection with highrisk HPV



Most frequently diagnosed between the ages **35 to 44**





Hispanic women have highest rates of cervical cancer in GA



Black women are more often diagnosed with later stage cervical cancer in GA



6 out of 10 cervical cancers occur in women who have never had a Pap test (Pap Smear) or have not been tested in the past 5 years



6 Up to 93% of cervical cancer cases could be prevented by screening and HPV vaccination



CERVICAL CANCER IS PREVENTABLE

HPV VACCINATION

- Prevents 90% of cervical cancers
- Age 9-45
- Talk to your doctor/pharmacist

PAP TEST (PAP SMEAR)

- Can find cervical cancer early when treatment is most effective
- Age 21-29
- Every 3 years

HPV TEST

- Looks for HPV virus
- Age 30-65 (*May choose between Pap test and HPV test or both)
- Every 5 years

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Georgia Breast and Cervical Cancer Program provides breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic testing at no cost to eligible women.
