Beach Fire Update-

NEW BEACH FIRE RULES GO INTO EFFECT ON FEBRUARY 12 by Dorie DeFranco

Beach fires built directly on the sand have always been illegal on San Diego City beaches. Unfortunately, many visitors haven't been following the rules, and many unsuspecting visitors have been burned by hot coals abandoned on the beach and covered with sand. Many of those harmed were young children.

The revised beach fire ordinance was passed unanimously by San Diego City Council 8-0 (Marino absent) on January 10th and signed by Mayor Gloria on January 13th.

It clarifies the municipal code language for law enforcement and will provide cleaner and safer City beaches for all visitors and reduce smoke pollution. It is supported by SD Police Dept, Park Rangers, SD Fire Dept, Lifeguards, the San Diego Regional Burn Center, community leaders and Town Councils at all City beaches and four members of the Environmental Committee, headed by Council Member Joe La Cava. See City of San Diego Municipal Code 63.20.5(c).

The Rules:

- NO BEACH FIRES MIDNIGHT TO 5AM
- WOOD AND CHARCOAL FIRES ARE ONLY ALLOWED IN CITY-PROVIDED
 FIRE RINGS (First come, first served where available)
- FUEL CAN NOT EXCEED 12" IN HEIGHT
- CLEAN, DRY WOOD AND CHARCOAL ONLY
- NO PALLETS, PAINTED WOOD OR NAILS
- PORTABLE PROPANE FUELED FIRE PITS, BARBECUES AND STOVES ARE ALLOWED

Please call the Non-Emergency Police phone at (619)531-2000 to report fires built on the sand or the burning of trash, furniture, etc.

Mr. and Mrs. McGill moved here from LA in 1998 and retired. They have been in the Barber Tract for 23 years. They have a big family with 6 children, 11 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren. On Pat's 80th birthday she was nicknamed "The Queen". She had a crown and her granddaughter made a video for her. They took a group photo and everyone was sitting on the wall with Pat sitting on her grandson's knee. "One of the most important things is to keep the family together," said Pat. "For us it's all about family life."

Mr. McGill worked for an aerospace company. He worked for the company that built the spirit of Saint Louis for Charles Lindbergh. He Flew the first transatlantic airplane that went from Long Island, New York to Paris all by himself. They moved from Michigan to San Diego and many other places until they finally came back to San Diego. One of their daughter's went to Poway High and the two younger daughter's went to the University of San Diego High School. The second time they came to San Diego, Mr. and Mrs. MeGill said that they're going to La Jolla. "We didn't want to live on the hill, we wanted walking distance to The Village." It took 1 1/2 years to find a house. The Barber Tract is a nice place to live." Since Mr. McGill used to do all his work, now Pat has time for her passion. Pat joined the Women's Club as the house director. The building is 108 years old and Pat makes sure the building stays healthy, clean, and beautiful. She says it keeps her busy and it's really fun for her.

Mr. and Mrs. McGill love traveling. A few years ago they took a cruise to China and they went around the coastline of east Asia. They started in Beijing and went down to Shanghai and Hong Kong and Singapore and Malaysia and Bangkok, and all the way down to Vietnam. They were transferred from place to place. But their favorite place to travel was Italy. They were there one time for two weeks. They lived in a farmhouse and had a rental car, which meant that they could go all over the place.
