- Local Drug Free Communities Fund

4. News Around the State and Nation

- The Ride and Rally for Recovery will be held on Saturday, September 7.
- A study by the American Medical Association shows evidence that 7% of pregnant women said they used marijuana in the past month, most commonly in the first trimester.
- A report published in JAMA Pediatrics highlights the association between prescription opioid use and heroin. The study found that adolescents and teens who use prescription opioids are more likely to start using heroin by high school graduation.
- The 2019 Recovery Month theme, "Join the Voices of Recovery: Together We Are Stronger," emphasizes the need to share resources and build networks.

5. Grantee Report: Monroe Police Department

- Grant funds were utilized to purchase in-car cameras.
- The new equipment is utilized in traffic stops and provides evidence for OWI's.
- Deputy Troy Habeggar will be installing the equipment.

Prevention Grants

- Grants have been approved by the County Council, County Commissioners and State. MOU's are being completed.
- North Adams Revision
