

He never traveled two hundred miles From the place where he was born. He did none of the things One usually associates with greatness. He had no credentials but himself. He was only thirty-three When the tide of public opinion Turned against him. His friends ran away. He was turned over to his enemies. And went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross Between two thieves. While he was dying. His executioners gambled for his clothing. The only property he had on Earth. When he was dead. He was laid in a borrowed grave Through the pity of a friend. Twenty centuries have come and gone, And today he is the central figure Of the human race. And the leader of mankind's progress. All the armies that ever marched, All the navies that ever sailed. All the parliament that ever sat. All the kings that ever reigned. Put together have not affected The life of man on Earth As much as that One Solitary Life.

The poem, now known as "One Solitary Life," was written by Dr. James Allen Francis and originated as a part of his sermon delivered on July 11, 1926 to the Baptist Young People's Union at the Los Angeles Convention.

It is upon the life of Jesus Christ that the years of the calendar are counted. It is His birth, life, death and resurrection which offer the hope of salvation for all humanity.

Those that claim Him as Savior, and even many who do not, celebrate His birth every year on December 25. Usually the whole month of December becomes a part of numerous celebrations. We gather every year at Acmar to celebrate as a community.

In 2014, a young couple, Wes and Elizabeth Hollaway, were ready to buy a home. They had been renting in Leeds and had some idea of what they were looking for. They wanted to be out of a city, but close enough for commuting for work. They had three large dogs, and they wanted enough land for the dogs to roam around. So, like any other house hunters today, they turned to Google! From there they eventually found a listing for a house with some land on Colgate Road in Moody. Before moving in, they created a large fenced in area for their dogs. They began clearing brush and kudzu. When they received a "Welcome Basket" from the Acmar United Methodist Church, they realized they had moved into a special community. That day, they began eating the cookies and reading the information about the history of Acmar. Like many people in this area, they had never heard of Acmar. They began receiving the Soul Miner church newsletter and enjoyed reading each month and learning more about their new "hometown." They learned they had neighbors they could call on if something was needed and neighbors learned the Hollaways could be counted on for help, too. In 2018, some adjacent land was auctioned and they were able to purchase that land, too.







Wes and Elizabeth love animals, but had never considered the possibility of having a farm. They did feel they had enough space now and caring in their hearts to begin fostering dogs from rescue shelters to give those facilities more time to find homes for the animals to avoid being euthanized.

When the Covid pandemic happened, suddenly they were working from home and had more free time to devote to animals. Elizabeth had always thought it would be fun to have some chickens, so they purchased four. As their chicken population grew, they decided to invest in two beautiful Great Pyrenees dogs to train as livestock guardians. They wanted to expand their four-legged family to include raising miniature goats. Their Nigerian Dwarf Goats are loved by anyone who sees them. Some of these were even a popular part of some 'goat yoga' sessions!



The Hollaways decided to call their operation "Acmar Acres Farm". Wes said they chose that name to honor their new community home.
