

FEATHERS IN THE WIND

As children, we were blessed by having grandparents and a mother who read stories to us. One day, a man gifted us with a volume of Hans Christian Andersen and the Grimm brothers. Naturally. they became our favorites, and we would not let anyone stop reading unless at least one of these stories was included. Years later, I was thrilled to learn that the Grimm brothers were librarians and had set out to collect stories, especially in the Hartz Mountains.

I was also blessed to have family and friends who could, and would, tell wonderful stories of their own. So now, let me tell you a story that you can choose to believe or not.

A year ago, thanks to Jon Childers and all the research that he did on World War I, I began doing some research of my own. It puzzled me what became of the German Kaiser, who was Queen Victoria's grandson. After World War I he seemed to have disappeared, never to have been heard of again, while other heads of state involved in the war were disposed of, killed, exiled or whatever. So I asked my eldest son who replied, "He went to the Netherlands and cut down trees."

The Kaiser was born with a withered arm that he hid from view, so how could he cut down trees? What was he doing in the Netherlands?

It turns out that our son was right, and the Netherlands had given the Kaiser asylum and a nice residence, which he occupied for more than two decades. His first wife died, soon after the war, and he quickly remarried.

When people came to call, the Kaiser would give them matchsticks from trees that he had cut.

While his sons supported the Nazis, the Kaiser wanted nothing more to do with Germany. When he died, he was buried in the Netherlands. He outlived his cousins, the King of England and the Russian Czar by decades.
