Dealing With Realities

On Saturday, April 9, our congregation received devastating news. Our beloved organist, Pat Olson, died suddenly. Those of us who were gathering that morning for The Journey came together, prayed and cried. We then cowboyed up and did what we needed to do to make sure The Journey was a success...in Pat's memory.

Early on, the leadership of the church agreed that a knee-jerk reaction to Pat's death- rush right out and hire a new musician- would be wrong. So we intentionally waited. During the interim, we have been incredibly blessed to have Molly Joseph and Anita Heard very capably provide music on Sundays.

And now, the next step begins. Over the past few weeks, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee (the church committee responsible for paid staff) has been, after much conversation and planning, advertising for a new "organist or pianist". The wording is intentional. The truth of the matter is that, as far back as 2010, there were only about 200 students pursuing college training in organ performance- nationwide. 200- to service the approximately 350,000 Christian congregations in this country. That's ONE organist for every 1,750 congregations. Those are not good odds. So we asked for organists AND pianists. The deadline for application is after this newsletter goes to press.

The other issue we are dealing with is the condition of the organ. Pat made that organ sing- anybody who heard her play knows that. But the truth is that more than one professional has looked at it, as well as a few very capable organists, and they all agree that there are major problems with the instrument. The bottom line, based on the recommendations offered by a specialist in organ repair and installation, is that it would take somewhere between \$70,000 and \$95,000 to fully repair our organ. And if we were to consider a new instrument, "the range of cost for a pipe organ for a small to medium sized church is in the area of \$200,000-\$850,000", according to the Associated Pipe Organ Builders of America. Sadly, those are astronomical figures for an instrument that we may or may not be able to even find someone to play.

On the other hand, a top of the line electronic instrument that can A. do everything we would want, including sound like a full organ, B. be played by anyone who can play the piano and C. connect directly into our sound system would be in the neighborhood of \$7,000-\$9,000. Like we were with the church bus at this time last year, we are at a crossroads with the organ. It has beautifully accompanied our praises to God for MANY decades. But everything has a life span and it seems apparent that our organ has reached the end of that span. (continued on page 3)

I understand the connection that many of us have to the pipe organ- I sincerely do. I also understand the reality of a ever-dwindling pool of organists and an astronomical cost for repair or replacement. Therefore, after **much** prayer and soul searching, it is my recommendation to both the Administrative Council and the Trustees that we "retire" the organ and replace it with a top-of-the-line electronic instrument that will still provide us with the sound we want, be extremely versatile and be much more in line with our current reality regarding available musicians and funds. I covet your prayers as we move forward.






CHURCH WEBSITE





Independence Day

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee but with Thomas

Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty...from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more." Adams' prediction was off by two days!

In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary. President James Monroe died exactly five years later, on July 4, 1831.

We have much to be grateful for in this country. Celebrate our nation's independence- thank God for our freedom!

Rock and Worship

On Sunday, September 11, a new day dawns at The Aledo United Methodist Church. Our new morning worship service- Rock and Worship- officially kicks off that day. This new service will be built around electric guitar, drums and bass. It will be a slightly shorter (50 minutes), more casual service. It will feature weekly Communion and a new original video Call to Worship each week that is based on the message for the day and built around a classic rock song. Both Sunday School (K-12th Grade) and Nursery (Birth-4 years old) are available. The new worship schedule will be:
