## **CONCUSSION COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The Concussion Committee, formed at last December's Chapter Board of Directors meeting, has been working diligently on finding ways to reduce the incidents of this ever more troubling blight on the sport of football. The Committee has decided that the best way for our Chapter to approach the topic is to do what we can to educate coaches and players as to proper tackling techniques. Studies have shown that the majority of concussions sustained in the sport are from improper tackling.



The Concussion Committee found three instructional videos on proper tackling fundamentals, including one featuring Seattle Seahawks coach Pete Carroll.
