Athlete – Class of 1988

Mickey Lincoln earned four MCS varsity letters in baseball, three in soccer and three in basketball. He was named to eight IAC All-Star First Teams: four in baseball, three in soccer and one in basketball. He was a key team member for tournament championships in basketball and soccer; IAC Division Championships in soccer, basketball and baseball; two Overall IAC Championships in soccer; and one Section IV Championship in soccer. He was honored as the 1988 MCS Male Athlete of the Year.

Mickey was stalwart as a soccer defender from his midfield and sweeper positions and still ranks 26th among all Olympians with 17 assists. His strongest sport was baseball where he excelled on the mound, in the infield, and at the plate. In his senior season he pitched a no-hitter with 11 strike outs and a single walk. In another game he pitched several perfect innings and hit for the cycle. After leaving MCS, Mickey was a standout pitcher at Onondaga Community College where he never lost a game and saved several. He recorded two saves for an Empire States Games silver medal team and pitched for the Binghamton Rangers during the summer. Upon transferring to the University of South Carolina-Coastal Carolina, he led the Division I Big South Conference in his senior year with 8 wins, 7 of them complete games, and a 2.93 ERA. He was named to the All-Conference Team.

Mickey resides in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina and remains active playing softball and golf, and in bowling where he has recorded eight perfect 300 games. He is also a coach for youth soccer and baseball.
