Clergy Column

Today's Gospel is a parable about a farmer who is sowing seed. Jesus tells us that as this man is scattering his seed, it falls in four distinct places. At the end of the parable, Jesus explains it to us, saying that the seed is the Good News—the coming of the Kingdom; he also explains the significance of the locations where the seeds fell. These locations are metaphors for various ways the human heart reacts when it hears the Good News.

Path

This person hears the word but does not understand it, and goes on with his sinful life.

Rocky Ground

This person hears the word, receives it with joy, but does not have strong resolve, and abandons the faith at the first difficulty.

Among Thorns

This person hears the word, but worldly anxieties and the lure of riches suffocate his desire to act on it.

Rich Soil

This person hears the word, and produces abundant fruit.

This is a cautionary message for us. Have we tilled the soil of our heart to make it a fruitful place to receive the Word of God?

"How we make crosses: The vertical bar pointing to the heavens is God's Will. The horizontal May our Blessed Mother hold us in bar contradicting it is our will. When our will is in conflict with God's Will, we have a cross. A cross in the mind is fear, anxiety, unhappiness. A Cross in the body is pain. How God Makes Crosses: Our life is going in a certain direction, maybe towards God. But it is a crooked way, or a slow road, or we tarry too long on the road. So God cuts another road cross-way to ours. As we cross His Will by sin, so He crosses our will be love to make us perfect, and when He does it comes out as pain, sacrifice, bereavement, trials and grief."

> If we are fighting to preserve the divine, then we are fighting a crucial war, for the word crucial is derived from crux or cross, and the cross has four dimensions: the "breath, and length, and height, and depth" (Esp. 3:18) of Christ's redeeming love on the cross. The battle cry of a horizontal war is generally "Freedom," the battle cry of a vertical war is generally "Justice," the battle cry of a crucial war is "God." Archbishop Fulton Sheen


