It's Time to Play Road Bingo

Every so often, at this time
of year, I make a suggestion
that you play Bingo “on the
road” while on vacation. Using
any search engine on the Internet
makes that increasingly easy. For
example, let's pick three cities,
pretend we are either going to visit
there or at least overnight there,
while on vacation.

My three picks are: Palm
Springs, California; Charleston,
South Carolina and Seattle,
Washington. By going to a search
engine and typing in the name
of the city and the word “Bingo,”
you'll be surprised at the results.
For example, going to Google and
typing in, “Palm Springs, Bingo,”
here is what I found.

One of the listings was “10
Best Bingo Halls in Palm Springs,
California.” This listing not only
showed where Bingo is played in
the city of Palm Springs – much
of it in hotels and clubs – but also
“major” Bingo at nearby Indian
casinos.

Typing in, “Charleston,
South Carolina, Bingo” yielded
the following: One site had the
complete listings of Bingo in the
entire state. Doing the same for
Seattle, Washington, showed
another list of “10 Bingo Halls” in
the area.

Additionally, with on-line
mapping as good as it is now
and easy to use, you can find
the distance from your motel (or
wherever you are staying) to the
nearest Bingo hall.



Now, one word of caution,
finding a Bingo hall on the exact
night you are going to be in a
specific city can be tricky. But, if
you are as much a lover of Bingo
as I am, you might want to change
your travel dates to correspond
with the nights in which Bingo is
played in the city you are visiting.

Some of the best times I have
had playing Bingo while on the
road, have been just that... “On
The Road.” Remember when
we went to a hall near the New
Orleans airport that played Bingo
every night? It was the Lions
Bingo Hall. I went there two
consecutive nights. By the way,
the food was incredible.

And, one of my favorite Bingo
halls is also “On The Road.” It's
the huge Reflections Bingo on
the north side of Phoenix. For
my money, it's one of the most
efficiently run, friendliest and
“tastiest” Bingo halls I have ever

visited. But, let's not forget the
basement hall in my old grade
school in Washington, Indiana,
where I first played Bingo in 1957.
And, if you remember, I play there
when I visit my hometown. Yes,
they are still playing Bingo after
all these years.

So, the moral: Play Bingo
everywhere you can. Keep the
game going, everywhere.

MONTANA OKAYS SPORTS BETTING

Montana has become the ninth
state to legalize sports betting.
There is also similar legislation
sitting on the desks of governors
in Tennessee, Iowa, Colorado and
Indiana. Governor Steve Bullock
signed what is called the “Montana
Sports Betting Legislation”
authorizing Montana's state
lottery to offer wagering services
via the state's current lottery
provider, Intralot. Some are

complaining that as the “only
game in town,” Intralot will have
little incentive to create customer-
friendly odds. Additionally, it
could act as a gaming monopoly.

A BIG MONTH IN NEW YORK

All during the month of May,
the Rivers Casino and Resort in
Schenectady, New York held a
huge slot promotion in an effort
to boost business. Patrons were
offered a chance to win up to
\$10,000 in free slot play during
the month. There was only one
hitch. At each drawing, the winner
had to be present to win and had
only three minutes to report to the
contest table to claim the prize.

WYNN HIT BY BIG FINE

The Massachusetts Gaming
Commission recently released its
Decision and Order regarding the
suitability of Wynn Resort and its
individual qualifiers. According to
government records, in reaching
its decision, the five-member
commission carefully considered
all of the facts presented in the
comprehensive Investigations
and Enforcement Bureau report.
Other elements were scrutinized,
including witness testimony and
evidence. They were entered into
the record during and after the
adjudicatory hearing held earlier
this year. The final decision: A
\$35-million-dollar fine against Wynn.

Bubbles and Bingo

The second annual Lucky for Literacy Bubbles and Bingo Luncheon fundraiser was held at the Post Oak Hotel in Houston, Texas, and generated \$85,000 for the iWRITE Literacy Organization, a local nonprofit that serves economically disadvantaged schools in the greater Houston area. Some 250 guests attended the costume-themed event, which included white tablecloth dining with pink champagne and eight rounds of highly competitive Bingo for prizes such as designer jewelry and handbags, and Pilates classes. The luncheon’s proceeds benefit iWRITE’s annual programming for children’s literacy in Houston schools that allow kids to see their work turned into books they can sign. Guests also funded scholarships for fifteen students to the iWRITE Creative Writing Summer Camp. In addition, the nonprofit partnered with KPMG Family for Literacy to provide books to all students at a youth development center.

a law stating that community organizations without a state-issued license can only host Bingo games up to 15 days per year. State Sen. Toby Ann Stavisky (D-Flushing) wants to allow non-licensed groups to enjoy Bingo legally for up to two times a week. “It’s not about gambling, it’s about socializing,” said Stavisky, who described the legislation as a “common sense” bill, which was approved by the State Senate and at press time was still being reviewed by the State Assembly’s Committee on Racing and Wagering. The proposal does not change the maximum prize of \$150 per year; it only expands the number of games allowed and covers nonprofit and religious organizations.

Chicken Poop Bingo in Arizona

Tucson Village Farm and the Tucson Hop Shop recently launched their first annual Chicken Poop Bingo event to raise funds for summer camp scholarships for kids. Two of the farm’s hens and a custom game board with 50 numbers on it were set up at Tucson Hop Shop. For a suggested donation of \$3, guests received a raffle ticket with a number on it. A chicken was then placed on the board and whichever number it pooped on was the winner.

Bingo Monitor Goes X-Rated

Bingo night took an unexpected turn at a Canadian Carnival Bingo hall, when a ball monitor suddenly started showing an X-rated film clip. The shocking event in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, is being blamed on a hacker who exploited new technology recently implemented in the hall, according to news reports. It’s unclear how long the pornographic footage ran on the screen that was hacked, but one player managed to film the incident and post it on Facebook.

New Legislation Protects “Social” Bingo

A group of Bingo players from Queens, New York, are the catalyst for change in the state’s gaming regulations. It all began when seniors who played Bingo several times a week at a senior center were labeled criminals and fined by the state for breaking

VA, Medicare and Opioids

Half of veterans who are enrolled in Department of Veterans Affairs health care also are signed up with Medicare Part D. What that means is they can get their prescriptions from either the VA or Medicare through a civilian doctor... or too often from both. those who received drugs from only the VA or Medicare.

This indicates a very likely pattern — patients who are able to get painkillers from two sources just might use both.

Now the VA and Medicare have hooked up with a program to monitor drug prescriptions, including opioids. The VA will be able to keep an eye on drugs prescribed by health-care sources outside the VA and will know if anyone has been prescribed double the amount.

What the press release doesn’t say is just how the VA plans to monitor the drug prescriptions. Will it have access to a patient’s file at a civilian doctor? Will it have access to the Medicare computer? Or the pharmacy? Between the doctor, the pharmacy and Medicare, at what point will the VA know what’s being prescribed?

And if a drug is doubly prescribed for a veteran, what is the VA going to do about it?

The biggest question of all: Will this require new computer software at the VA? If so, it could take some time.

My best friend “P” and I split video poker jackpots for years...no issues ever. Then others decided to get in on the action. (Of course, we believe we double, triple or quadruple our chances with our group investment.)
I hit a jackpot for a few thousand, split three ways between “K”, “P” and me. The next year, “K” hit a nice jackpot, split four ways. Well, the following year, at tax season, “K” came back to us and asked us to pay her \$25 each. She proceeded to tell us that because of hitting that jackpot and having to claim it on taxes, she would have received \$100 more back from her tax refund! She didn’t seem to care at all that I had to claim it when I hit!
I explained she benefited much more from the group win than that \$100 and she didn’t seem to worry about it when I had to claim it, and...who does that!? Who comes back on their friends a year later asking for money like that!?

We were all upset and reluctantly agreed to pay her. So, then we came up with a “K’ tax rule.” From that point on, we take 20% off the top no matter what tax bracket you’re in and no coming back on anyone at any time!
To this day, I get upset thinking about what nerve she had and how terrible that situation was. The right thing to do would have been to accept the situation and ask us to come up with a plan for the future. That would have made sense to everyone involved.
As one other person wrote: “S-A-D” to put a \$25 price tag on friends and relationships.
On a positive note, a few years later, I had a dream that I hit this progressive jackpot in Tahoe. The good news is that my dream came true. I was splitting again with “P” and, yes, “K”. I hit \$8,500 and was able to take \$1,700 off the top for taxes then split the rest with my two friends...and I was happy to be able to do it! — **Taxing Situation**

Hi Taxing,
Readers may recall that I had not planned on running additional letters on the topic of splitting Bingo pots with friends, but I found yours so intriguing that I had to pass it along.
Your friend “K” does have a point—a sizeable Bingo jackpot can affect your bottom line and your tax return. But your point is an equally good one, which I, and others who wrote in noted: It isn’t fair to spring a change to the original agreement on your fellow

players when it suits you.
This is the reason why the world is overflowing with lawyers, judges and courtrooms. There will always be someone who decides to reinterpret an agreement so that it works in his or her favor, creating the need for a third party to insure in writing beforehand so that this can’t happen, or settle the problem after the fact.
Luckily, you and your friends decided to go along with “K’s” request and chip in the extra \$25. (Not how I expected your story to go!) And, of course, now you all build in the 20% tax “lien” for all prizes which, 1. Covers you for the future and, 2. Gives the actual winner a bit more of the winnings for taxes or whatever else comes up.

I think the bigger surprise is that you all continue to play Bingo together. As you wrote in your email: “To this day, I still get upset thinking about what nerve she had and how terrible that situation was.” But, in that moment, you managed to rise above it, seeing that it was worth \$25 for you to put the matter to rest. Way to go!
Clearly, you were the adult in the room and chose to be the bigger person. That knowledge should help you put the experience behind you and not let it upset you ever again. — **Guy**

Lucky Lotto News

Long Odds, Big Prize

Manuel Franco, 24, of West Allis, Wisconsin, is the winner of a Powerball lottery ticket worth \$768.4 million. “It was amazing,” he says. “My heart started racing, blood pumping. I screamed for about five or ten minutes. Good thing my neighbors didn’t hear.” Franco took the cash option of approximately \$477 million and received just over \$326 million after taxes. The jackpot is the third largest behind the world record \$1.6 billion Powerball jackpot shared by winners in California, Florida, and Tennessee in January 2016 and a \$1.5 billion Mega Millions jackpot won in South Carolina last fall. The odds of matching all six balls in the Powerball drawing were 1 in 292.2 million. Franco’s winning numbers were 16, 20, 37, 44, and 62, with Powerball number 12.

Redneck Millionaire

Timothy Seratt has lived paycheck to paycheck his whole life. Born and raised in Dyersburg, Tennessee, the 32-year-old father of two has never owned property, flown on a plane or traveled far from home. Now, after winning the lottery, he’s a millionaire with lots of plans. Seratt won \$2 million on a Mega Millionaire Jumbo Bucks scratch-off, taking home \$1.3 million after taxes. “It’s still

crazy,” he says of his win, adding that first on his agenda is buying a home. He’s also paying off his mom’s house and taking his kids to Disney World. After that, Seratt intends to invest the rest—after he buys a truck. But, he says, he won’t stop working or change who he is. “I might have a lot of money, but I’m still a redneck,” he says. “I’ve always been a redneck. That ain’t never going to change.”

Texas Lotto Introduces New Feature

Texas Lottery players now have more chances to win when they play Pick 3 and Daily 4 by purchasing Fireball, a new add-on feature for both daily draw games. “Fireball gives our players more opportunities to create winning combinations and increase their chances of winning,” says Gary Grief, executive director of the Texas Lottery. Following each Pick 3 and Daily 4 base game drawing, Pick 3 Fireball and Daily 4 Fireball numbers are drawn separately from a set of 10 balls numbered 0 through 9. To create Fireball prizewinning combinations, the Pick 3 Fireball number can be used to replace any one of the three drawn Pick 3 winning numbers, and the Daily 4 Fireball number can replace any one of the four drawn Daily 4 winning numbers.

Poker Talk



Chip Preservation Is Critical

Have you ever come across a great opportunity but just didn’t have the resources to take advantage? If you play tournament poker, there’s a good chance you have.

Certain hands come along that will leave you second-guessing yourself for one reason or another. In a recent \$1,100-buy-in Mid-States Poker Tour main event, I played two back-to-back hands that left me with full of regret.

In the first hand, I was sitting with 26,000 when the blinds were at 200-400 with an ante of 400. A player opened for 1,200 from early position, and I looked down at As Kh in the cutoff. I three-bet to 3,500 with “Big Slick” (the nickname for an ace-king starting hand), and the player in the small blind wound up four-betting all in for 17,000.

The original raiser folded, and action was back on me. A four-bet jam is a somewhat rare move in tournament poker and almost always indicative of a premium hand. Ace-king is a strong hand, but not against such a narrow range. It would be way behind pocket aces or pocket kings, and it would be a coin flip against other pocket pairs such as queens, jacks or tens. The only hand the small blind might shove with that I’d dominate would be ace-queen.

My gut said fold, but instead I talked myself into calling with the hope that my opponent had either ace-queen or a pocket pair of queens or lower to make it a race. That wasn’t the case, as he proudly rolled over Ah Ad.

The 10s 6h 7c flop didn’t do me any favors, though the Kc turn did keep me drawing live. I needed another king on the river to win the pot, but it wasn’t in the cards, as the 8s peeled off instead. Just like that I lost two-thirds of my stack.

In the very next hand, Mid-States Poker Tour champ Ahmed Taleb raised to 900, and I looked down at As Ah. What a beautiful sight.

I didn’t want to scare everyone away by moving all in, so I three-bet to 2,000. Action folded back to Taleb and he called to see a flop of Ac 9h 3s.

The flop hit me in a big way, but that also meant it probably missed my opponent. I didn’t want Taleb to fold, so I downsized my bet to just 1,000, hoping he would make a move. Much to my delight, he check-raised all in, and I happily called off.

I was surprised to see Taleb table Ad 9c for two pair. The flop had hit him big, too and I immediately had regrets. Namely, why hadn’t I folded my ace-king in the prior hand and preserved my chip stack? Had I done so, I could have doubled to 50,000 in this hand.

The board ran out in my favor, and I won a smaller pot than I might have otherwise.

Obviously, things may not have went down exactly that way if I’d played the previous hand differently - maybe the dealer’s shuffle would’ve been different, for instance - but it was a good reminder that in marginal spots it’s worth folding to maintain your stack, as you never know what sort of opportunities you’ll be presented with in the next hand.

What’s New in Nevada

UNLV AND CAESARS PLAN STUDY CENTER

According to a press release from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) and hospitality giant Caesars Entertainment, the two entities are joining forces to create what is being touted as a “technology hub.” The facility will be used to test new concepts in hospitality and gaming. The “hub,” which will contain about 43-thousand-square-feet of space, will have mock hotel rooms, a casino and an e-sports area. The complex could begin operations before the year is over.

MORE PINK SLIPS AT MGM

According to published reports, Las Vegas-based casino company MGM Resorts International will be cutting as many as 1,000 jobs in the coming weeks. One report

says that the recipients of the pink slips will include about 250 workers who were already targeted for dismissal. Additionally, MGM says that 35 executives have already taken voluntary retirement as part of the entertainment company’s plan to increase annual earnings by \$300 million over the next two years.

DEVELOPER TO OPEN HIS OWN SPORTSBOOKS

There are published reports that casino owner and developer Derek Stevens is set to open his own Las Vegas sportsbooks. Circa Sports, which recently got the go-ahead from the Nevada Gaming Commission, is opening facilities at the Golden Gate and at The D Las Vegas shortly thereafter. Stevens owns both downtown casinos.

The Long-Term Care Benefit Many Veterans Are Missing Out On

Dear Savvy Senior,
I have heard that the VA has a benefit that can help veterans and spouses with long-term care costs. We recently had to move my 86-year-old father, who served in the army nearly 60 years ago, into an assisted living facility, and my mom isn't far behind. Can the VA help? — **Seeking Aid**

Dear Seeking,
The Veterans Administration does indeed have a little-known, underutilized benefit that can help wartime veterans and their surviving spouses pay for a variety of long-term care costs.
This benefit, called "Aid and Attendance," is a special pension that's paid in addition to a basic pension. It pays a maximum of \$2,230 a month to married veterans; \$1,881 a month to single veterans; or \$1,209 a month to a surviving spouse. The money is tax free, and can be used to pay for in-home care, assisted living and nursing home care.
Today, only around 230,000 veterans and survivors are receiving Aid and Attendance, but millions more are eligible and either don't know about it, or don't think they can qualify for it.

Eligibility Requirements
To qualify, your dad must have served at least 90 days of active military service with at least one

day of service during a period of war, and not have been discharged dishonorably. Single surviving spouses of wartime vets are eligible if their marriage ended due to death.
In addition, your dad will also have to meet certain thresholds for medical and financial need to be eligible.
To qualify medically he must be either disabled, or over the age of 65 and need help with basic everyday living tasks such as eating, dressing, bathing or going to the bathroom. Being blind or in a nursing home or assisted living facility due to mental disability also qualifies him. Single surviving spouses have no age restrictions, but they must require help with basic everyday living tasks to be eligible.

To qualify financially, your parents must have limited assets, under \$127,061, excluding their home, vehicle and personal belongings. And their annual income (minus medical and long-term care expenses) cannot exceed the Maximum Allowable Pension Rate (MAPR), which in 2019 is \$26,766 for a veteran and their spouse; \$22,577 for a single veteran; and \$14,509 for a surviving spouse.
To calculate your parent's income qualifications, add up their income over the past year (including Social Security, pensions, interest income from investments, annuities, etc.), minus any out-of-pocket medical expenses, prescription drugs, insurance premiums and long-term care costs over that same period of time. If the final tally is under the MAPR, and he meets the other requirements, he should be eligible for aid.

How to Apply
To learn more, or to apply for Aid and Attendance, contact your regional VA benefit office (see [Benefits.va.gov/benefits/offices.asp](https://benefits.va.gov/benefits/offices.asp) or call 800-827-1000) where you can apply in person. You can also apply by writing the Pension Management Center for your state (see [Benefits.va.gov/pension/resources-contact.asp](https://benefits.va.gov/pension/resources-contact.asp)). You'll need to include evidence, like VA Form 21-2680 (va.gov/vaforms) that your dad's doctor can fill out that shows his need for Aid and Attendance.
If you need some help, you can appoint a Veteran Service Officer (VSO), a VA-accredited attorney or claims agent to represent your dad. See www.ebenefits.va.gov/ebenefits/vso-search to locate someone.
If your dad is eligible, it will take between six and 12 months for his application to be processed, so be patient. You should also know that if your dad's Aid and Attendance application is approved, the VA will send a lump sum retroactive payment covering the time from the day you filed the application until the day it was approved. Then your dad receives monthly payments going forward.



Veal Marsala Alternative

Dear Annie,
My husband loves veal marsala. It is not easy for me to buy veal and it is expensive. Can I make the same dish with another meat, poultry, etc.? I would really appreciate your help. — **Mary Sue from Hendersonville, N.C.**

Dear Mary Sue,
Here's a recipe for different type of Marsala dish. It is called Breast of Turkey in Marsala. — **Annie**

BREAST OF TURKEY IN MARSALA
1 pound thinly sliced raw turkey breast meat
½ lemon
½ cup or more seasoned flour
4-6 tablespoons butter
1/3 cup Marsala wine
1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/3 cup chicken soup
Cut turkey into convenient size pieces for serving and flatten with a knife. Rub each piece on both sides with cut lemon; coat with seasoned flour. Melt butter in large frying pan over gentle heat; fry breasts for 10 minutes, turning until golden on both sides. Pour in Marsala and allow to bubble for a minute or so. Sprinkle each breast thickly with Parmesan and moisten with chicken soup. Cover pan and cook gently for another 5 to minutes until turkey is tender and cheese is melted. Serve with pan juices poured over turkey. Chicken breasts may be substituted for turkey. Yield: 4 servings.
