# It's Time to Play Road Bingo

very so often, at this time of year, I make a suggestion that you play Bingo "on the road" while on vacation. Using any search engine on the Internet makes that increasingly easy. For example, let's pick three cities, pretend we are either going to visit there or at least overnight there, while on vacation.

My three picks are: Palm Springs, California; Charleston, South Carolina and Seattle, Washington. By going to a search engine and typing in the name of the city and the word "Bingo," you'll be surprised at the results. For example, going to Google and typing in, "Palm Springs, Bingo," here is what I found.

One of the listings was "10 Best Bingo Halls in Palm Springs, California." This listing not only showed where Bingo is played in the city of Palm Springs – much of it in hotels and clubs – but also "major" Bingo at nearby Indian casinos.

Typing in, "Charleston, South Carolina, Bingo" yielded the following: One site had the complete listings of Bingo in the entire state. Doing the same for Seattle, Washington, showed another list of "10 Bingo Halls" in the area.

Additionally, with on-line mapping as good as it is now and easy to use, you can find the distance from your motel (or wherever you are staying) to the nearest Bingo hall.



Now, one word of caution, finding a Bingo hall on the exact night you are going to be in a specific city can be tricky. But, if you are as much a lover of Bingo as I am, you might want to change your travel dates to correspond with the nights in which Bingo is played in the city you are visiting.

Some of the best times I have had playing Bingo while on the road, have been just that... "On The Road." Remember when we went to a hall near the New Orleans airport that played Bingo every night? It was the Lions Bingo Hall. I went there two consecutive nights. By the way, the food was incredible.

And, one of my favorite Bingo halls is also "On The Road." It's the huge Reflections Bingo on the north side of Phoenix. For my money, it's one of the most efficiently run, friendliest and "tastiest" Bingo halls I have ever visited. But, let's not forget the basement hall in my old grade school in Washington, Indiana, where I first played Bingo in 1957. And, if you remember, I play there when I visit my hometown. Yes, they are still playing Bingo after all these years.

So, the moral: Play Bingo everywhere you can. Keep the game going, everywhere.

# Gaming News

#### MONTANA OKAYS SPORTS BETTING

Montana has become the ninth state to legalize sports betting. There is also similar legislation sitting on the desks of governors in Tennessee, Iowa, Colorado and Indiana. Governor Steve Bullock signed what is called the "Montana Sports Betting Legislation" authorizing Montana's state lottery to offer wagering services via the state's current lottery provider, Intralot. Some are complaining that as the "only game in town," Intralot will have little incentive to create customerfriendly odds. Additionally, it could act as a gaming monopoly.

#### A BIG MONTH IN NEW YORK

All during the month of May, the Rivers Casino and Resort in Schenectady, New York held a huge slot promotion in an effort to boost business. Patrons were offered a chance to win up to \$10,000 in free slot play during the month. There was only one hitch. At each drawing, the winner had to be present to win and had only three minutes to report to the contest table to claim the prize.

#### WYNN HIT BY BIG FINE

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission recently released its Decision and Order regarding the suitability of Wynn Resort and its individual qualifiers. According to government records, in reaching its decision, the five-member commission carefully considered all of the facts presented in the comprehensive Investigations and Enforcement Bureau report. Other elements were scrutinized, including witness testimony and evidence. They were entered into the record during and after the adjudicatory hearing held earlier this year. The final decision: A \$35-million-dollar fine against Wynn.

# **Bubbles and Bingo**

The second annual Lucky for Literacy Bubbles and Bingo Luncheon fundraiser was held at the Post Oak Hotel in Houston, Texas, and generated \$85,000 for the iWRITE Literacy Organization, a local nonprofit that serves economically disadvantaged schools in the greater Houston area. Some 250 guests attended the costume-themed event, which included white tablecloth dining with pink champagne and eight rounds of highly competitive Bingo for prizes such as designer jewelry and handbags, and Pilates classes. The luncheon's proceeds benefit iWRITE's annual programming for children's literacy in Houston schools that allow kids to see their work turned into books they can sign. Guests also funded scholarships for fifteen students to the iWRITE Creative Writing Summer Camp. In addition, the nonprofit partnered with KPMG Family for Literacy to provide books to all students at a youth development center.

# **Bingo Monitor Goes** X-Rated

Bingo night took an unexpected turn at a Canadian Carnival Bingo hall, when a ball monitor suddenly started showing an X-rated film clip. The shocking event in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, is being blamed on a hacker who exploited new technology recently implemented in the hall, according to news reports. It's unclear how long the pornographic footage ran on the screen that was hacked, but one player managed to film the incident and post it on Facebook.

# New Legislation Protects "Social" Bingo

A group of Bingo players from Queens, New York, are the catalyst for change in the state's gaming regulations. It all began when seniors who played Bingo several times a week at a senior center were labeled criminals and fined by the state for breaking a law stating that community organizations without a stateissued license can only host Bingo games up to 15 days per year. State Sen. Toby Ann Stavisky (D-Flushing) wants to allow non-licensed groups to enjoy Bingo legally for up to two times a week. "It's not about gambling, it's about socializing," said Stavisky, who described the legislation as a "common sense" bill, which was approved by the State Senate and at press time was still being reviewed by the State Assembly's Committee on Racing and Wagering. The proposal does not change the maximum prize of \$150 per year; it only expands the number of games allowed and covers nonprofit and religious organizations.

# Chicken Poop Bingo in Arizona

Tucson Village Farm and the Tucson Hop Shop recently launched their first annual Chicken Poop Bingo event to raise funds for summer camp scholarships for kids. Two of the farm's hens and a custom game board with 50 numbers on it were set up at Tucson Hop Shop. For a suggested donation of \$3, guests received a raffle ticket with a number on it. A chicken was then placed on the board and whichever number it pooped on was the winner.

# VA, Medicare and Opioids

Half of veterans who are enrolled in Department of Veterans Affairs health care also are signed up with Medicare Part D. What that means is they can get their prescriptions from either the VA or Medicare through a civilian doctor... or too often from both. Until now there has been no way to tell if a veteran was collecting opioids from both sources.

A recent study looked at 200 patients who died and 800 others, categorizing them as VA only, Medicare only or both. Of these, 60 patients who died and 117 control patients had received opioid prescriptions from both sources. They had a much higher chance of dying from drug overdose than to monitor drug prescriptions, including opioids. The VA will be able to keep an eye on drugs prescribed by health-care sources outside the VA and will know if anyone has been prescribed double the amount.

What the press release doesn't say is just how the VA plans to monitor the drug prescriptions. Will it have access to a patient's file at a civilian doctor? Will it have access to the Medicare computer? Or the pharmacy? Between the doctor, the pharmacy and Medicare, at what point will the VA know what's being prescribed?

And if a drug is doubly prescribed for a veteran, what is the VA going to do about it?

The biggest question of all: Will this require new computer software at the VA? If so, it could take some time.

# Long Odds, Big Prize

Manuel Franco, 24, of West Allis, Wisconsin, is the winner of a Powerball lottery ticket worth \$768.4 million. "It was amazing," he says. "My heart started racing, blood pumping. I screamed for about five or ten minutes. Good thing my neighbors didn't hear." Franco took the cash option of approximately \$477 million and received just over \$326 million after taxes. The jackpot is the third largest behind the world record \$1.6 billion Powerball jackpot shared by winners in California, Florida, and Tennessee in January 2016 and a \$1.5 billion Mega Millions jackpot won in South Carolina last fall. The odds of matching all six balls in the Powerball drawing were 1 in 292.2 million. Franco's winning numbers were 16, 20, 37, 44, and 62, with Powerball number 12.







Most of the basic playing strategy is logical to players. For example, players understand why they shouldn't hit a 16 when the dealer shows a 6 upcard, or why they should split 8s against a dealer's 5. However, some of the basic strategy is not so intuitive: like hitting a 12 against a dealer's 3 upcard, or splitting a pair of 8s against dealer's 10. I will examine a few of these non-intuitive hands and provide some justification for the proper, albeit not always apparent, basic strategy.

# Hitting 12 Against Dealer's 3 Upcard

There is a "rule" in blackjack that says you should never risk busting your hand when the dealer shows a weak upcard. That may be true for most stiff hands but it's not the case when you are holding a 12 against a 3. When you think about it, there are only four cards that could bust your 12 - a ten, jack, queen, or king. On the other hand, five cards will get you to 17-21 (a five, six, seven, eight, or nine). Therefore, more cards will get you into the safe 17-21 zone than will break you. The other factor that works in your favor is the dealer's 3 upcard, which is not as weak as, say, a 4, 5, or 6 upcard (she will bust less with a 3 upcard compared to the 4, 5, or 6). The bottom line is that you will lose slightly less by hitting 12 against a 3 than by standing.

# Splitting 8s Against Dealer's 10 Upcard

If I told you that playing an 8 twice, against a dealer 10, loses less money than playing a 16 once, would you believe me? Probably not, but guess what, it's true. When you hit 16 against a dealer 10, you'll win only 23% of the time and lose 77%, meaning you'll win about four hands out of every 17. This is why holding a 16 against a 10 is the worst hand in blackjack. However, when your 16 is a pair of 8s, you have an out, namely splitting, because now your chances of winning when you start each hand with a single 8 against a 10 are 38%. In both cases (hitting and splitting), you are going to lose money, but it's still cheaper to win 38 hands and lose 62 on each 8 (by splitting) than to win 23 hands and lose 77 once (by hitting). Still not convinced? Here's the simple math to prove this point.

**Hit**: Bet \$10 on the hand. Win 23 hands for a total win of \$230. Lose 77 hands for a total loss of \$770. After 100 hands, your net loss is \$770 minus \$230, or \$540.

**Split**: Splitting 100 hands of 8s creates 200 hands, with each hand starting with an 8. If you bet \$10 on each split 8, you'll win 76 hands (38% of 200), for a total win of \$760. You'll lose 124 hands for a total loss of \$1,240. Your net loss is \$480. Therefore, losing \$480 (by splitting) is, I'm sure you'll agree, better than losing \$540 by hitting.

# Doubling Down 11 Against Dealer's Ten Upcard

Basic strategy says to double down on 11 against a dealer 10. However, many players chicken out and hit instead because they are afraid that the dealer might have a pat 20. Well, did you know that when the dealer has a ten upcard (and doesn't have a blackjack), he will wind up with a 20 roughly 33% of the time? Meanwhile, a player holding an 11 and taking one card (i.e., doubling down), has roughly a 31% chance of getting a 21 (by drawing a ten) and an 8% chance of making a 20 (by drawing a nine). In other words, you are considerably more likely to make a 20 or 21 with a one-card draw than the dealer is to make a 20. Moreover, think about this: if you draw a 7, 8, 9, or 10, and the dealer has the same card in the hole, you still win! Even though doubling lowers slightly your chances of winning (because if you draw a small card, you can't hit again to improve your total) your monetary gain is still greater by doubling because you bet twice as much.



# Chip Preservation **Is Critical**

Have you ever come across a great opportunity but just didn't have the resources to take advantage? If you play tournament poker, there's a good chance you have.

Certain hands come along that will leave you second-guessing vourself for one reason or another. In a recent \$1,100-buy-in Mid-States Poker Tour main event, I played two back-to-back hands that left me with full of regret.

In the first hand, I was sitting with 26,000 when the blinds were at 200-400 with an ante of 400. A player opened for 1,200 from early position, and I looked down at As Kh in the cutoff. I threebet to 3,500 with "Big Slick" (the nickname for an ace-king starting hand), and the player in the small blind wound up four-betting all in for 17,000.

The original raiser folded, and action was back on me. A fourbet jam is a somewhat rare move in tournament poker and almost always indicative of a premium hand. Ace-king is a strong hand, but not against such a narrow range. It would be way behind pocket aces or pocket kings, and it would be a coin flip against other pocket pairs such as queens, jacks or tens. The only hand the small blind might shove with that I'd dominate would be ace-queen.

My gut said fold, but instead

me any favors, though the Kc turn did keep me drawing live. I needed stack.

In the very next hand, Mid-States Poker Tour champ Ahmed Taleb raised to 900, and I looked down at As Ah. What a beautiful sight.

I didn't want to scare everyone away by moving all in, so I threebet to 2,000. Action folded back to Taleb and he called to see a flop of Ac 9h 3s.

The flop hit me in a big way, but that also meant it probably missed my opponent. I didn't want Taleb to fold, so I downsized my bet to just 1,000, hoping he would make a move. Much to my delight, he check-raised all in, and I happily called off.

I was surprised to see Taleb table Ad 9c for two pair. The flop had hit him big, too and I immediately had regrets. Namely, why hadn't I folded my ace-king in the prior hand and preserved my chip stack? Had I done so, I could have doubled to 50,000 in this hand.

The board ran out in my favor, and I won a smaller pot than I might have otherwise.

Obviously, things may not have went down exactly that way if I'd played the previous hand differently - maybe the dealer's shuffle would've been different, for instance - but it was a good reminder that in marginal spots it's worth folding to maintain your stack, as you never know what sort of opportunities you'll be presented with in the next hand.





day of service during a period of war, and not have been discharged dishonorably. Single surviving spouses of wartime vets are eligible if their marriage ended due to death.

In addition, your dad will also have to meet certain thresholds for medical and financial need to be eligible.

To qualify medically he must be either disabled, or over the age of 65 and need help with basic everyday living tasks such as eating, dressing, bathing or going to the bathroom. Being blind or in a nursing home or assisted living facility due to mental disability also qualifies him. Single surviving spouses have no age restrictions, but they must require help with basic everyday living tasks to be eligible.

To qualify financially, your parents must have limited assets, under \$127,061, excluding their home, vehicle and personal belongings. And their annual income (minus medical and long-term care expenses) cannot exceed the Maximum Allowable Pension Rate (MAPR), which in 2019 is \$26,766 for a veteran and their spouse; \$22,577 for a single veteran; and \$14,509 for a surviving spouse.

To calculate your parent's income qualifications, add up their income over the past year (including Social Security, pensions, interest income from investments, annuities, etc.), minus any out-of-pocket medical expenses, prescription drugs, insurance premiums and longterm care costs over that same period of time. If the final tally is under the MAPR, and he meets the other requirements, he should be eligible for aid.

# How to Apply

To learn more, or to apply for Aid and Attendance, contact your regional VA benefit office (see Benefits.va.gov/benefits/ offices.asp or call 800–827–1000) where you can apply in person. You can also apply by writing the Pension Management Center for your state (see Benefits.va.gov/ pension/resources-contact.asp). You'll need to include evidence, like VA Form 21-2680 (VA.gov/ vaforms) that your dad's doctor can fill out that shows his need for Aid and Attendance.

# The Long-Term Care Benefit Many Veterans Are Missing Out On

# Dear Savvy Senior,

I have heard that the VA has a benefit that can help veterans and spouses with long-term care costs. We recently had to move my 86-year-old father, who served in the army nearly 60 years ago, into an assisted living facility, and my mom isn't far behind. Can the VA help? — **Seeking Aid** 

#### Dear Seeking,

The Veterans Administration does indeed have a little-known, underutilized benefit that can help wartime veterans and their surviving spouses pay for a variety of long-term care costs.

This benefit, called "Aid and Attendance," is a special pension that's paid in addition to a basic pension. It pays a maximum of \$2,230 a month to married veterans; \$1,881 a month to single veterans; or \$1,209 a month to a surviving spouse. The money is tax free, and can be used to pay for in-home care, assisted living and nursing home care.

Today, only around 230,000 veterans and survivors are receiving Aid and Attendance, but millions more are eligible and either don't know about it, or don't think they can qualify for it.

# **Eligibility Requirements**

To qualify, your dad must have served at least 90 days of active military service with at least one

appoint a Veteran Service Officer (VSO), a VA-accredited attorney or claims agent to represent your dad. See www.ebenefits.va.gov/ ebenefits/vso-search to locate someone.

If your dad is eligible, it will take between six and 12 months for his application to be processed, so be patient. You should also know that if your dad's Aid and Attendance application is approved, the VA will send a lump sum retroactive payment covering the time from the day you filed the application until the day it was approved. Then your dad receives monthly payments going forward.


