



Now crossing the threshold into the new year is much simpler as I'm usually in bed by 10pm.

When I think of 2023, I am grateful for the precious gift of time and the life that fills it. As you cross the threshold into 2023, take a moment to pause. Stop to Remember, Respect and Regard.
