
Welcome to The Shire

Begin your journey on New Zealand's North Island in Hobbiton[™], just as Bilbo Baggins did. Two hours from Auckland, near Matamata, Hobbiton village is

nestled into a steep, verdant hillside with blooming trees, meandering paths, idyllic wooden fences and grass so lush it begs to be explored barefoot. The series was filmed at these unique Hobbit-hole homes that define the look of the enchanting set. Be sure to enjoy a traditional ale at The Green Dragon Inn to get into the festive Hobbit spirit.

Let the Fun Begin

Stay in a merry mood as you continue your trek to Tauranga. Here, the Jazz Village is located in the Historic Village on 17th Avenue, which is reminiscent of New Orleans' French Quarter. The village is a departure from the sprawling countryside, but is magical in its own ways. Cobblestone streets and wide-open two-story porches invite visitors to relax and enjoy the sounds of jazz music. Dixie music in the Village Hall will make you want to celebrate



great music and good times with as much fervor as the Hobbits celebrated Bilbo's birthday in The Lord of the Rings.

dourney Inland

Venture from civilization into the vast landscapes where filming of The Lord of the Rings first began. Outside Wellington, explore the forests of the Outer Shire and further south along the breathtakingly blue coastline lies an entrance to another world. Owhiro Bav's high-rising mountains are the

Gates of Mordor in The Lord of the Rings and you, too, will feel as small as Frodo and Sam amid the peaks seen from this stunning bay.

From Peaks to Valleys

The unbelievable scenery of middle-earth is at its best on New Zealand's South Island, Akaroa. near Christchurch, is a scenic gateway to journey up to Rakaia Gorge. The twisting Rakaia River's teal blue waters carve through steep, straight cliffs of rock. The brightness of the water

and its pebble-stone shores are accentuated by towering

pines and a backdrop of majestic snow-covered peaks. The Canterbury Plains pose an even greater contrast to the

surrounding mountains. This patchwork of farmlands across a wide open valley reaches to the edge of the

Southern Alps that then explode up into the sky. It's a beautiful vista that lends itself perfectly to Tolkien's fantasy world.

Oncient Landscapes

To the northwest of coastal Dunedin sits the small town of Middlemarch in Central Otago. This area was the craggy terrain where The Company was hunted by Orcs in The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey, which is only fitting given the area's epic landscape. Make your journey inland more enjoyable than the harried experience of the Hobbits by riding a vintage railcar through the winding mountains and along the Taieri River Gorge. Fiction comes oddly close to reality here, as the phrase middle-earth rather aptly describes this wild landscape, which includes volcanic outcrops and a crater lake that formed 20 million years ago.

On the Backs of Eagles

Milford Sound is arguably one of the most picturesque places in the world. The sound's incredible mountains rise up sharply out of serene waters and can at times be seen covered in greenery but also capped with snow. It's a magnificent contrast amid the varied landscape of the South Island.

The sound is part of Fiordland National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site, which made its appearance (one of many) in The Hobbit as the backdrop for the scene when The Company flees the mountain on the backs of eagles. Get a bird's-eye view of the dramatic fiords for yourself aboard a helicopter flight that

also provides spectacular views of the park's cascading waterfalls. For

an even more grand exploration, kayak or cruise along the water to get up-close with the local wildlifeincluding three species of dolphins, two species of penguins and New Zealand fur seals.
