FROM THE PASTOR

Just recently, some high school friends from Savannah, Georgia joined me for a Saturday morning of fun at the Amazing Maize Maze outside of Lancaster. On a crisp, clear day, we accepted the challenge of the oldest, largest and, in my opinion, best of all the corn mazes that have sprouted across the country. Laid out over five acres of ten-foot high corn with 2.5 miles of trails, "the world's greatest free-standing brain teaser," as the Cherry Crest Adventure Farm puts it, is chock full of twists and turns leading to dead ends, cries of "Eureka!" at finding puzzle pieces that help determine the way to Victory (the way out) and groans of disappointment when there seems to be nowhere else to go.

To be sure, there is a Tower Guide sitting high above the corn maze who is there to offer advice should one request it. But we supposedly intelligent and self-assured adults avoided that alternative, wanting to conquer the maze purely through our own efforts. Finally, however, needing to return home for my wife, Barbara's, planned luncheon, we had to admit defeat after two hours of running around from pillar to post in this most frustrating of games that bears a marked resemblance to the game of life.

Yes, I said it: the game of life. If you can imagine the Tower Guide as a god-like figure gazing omnipotently upon us gerbil-like humans scurrying around, asking others where to find puzzle pieces or the elusive entrance to the pathway leading to Victory, then you can sense the role that religion plays in an often senseless, meaningless and confusing passage through life. Wasn't it Jesus, after all, Who said, "I am the <u>way</u>, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father (to ultimate victory) but by me" (Jn. 14:6)?

Now I don't want to suggest for a moment that negotiating a corn maze is anywhere near the joyful complexity—and, paradoxically, simplicity—of our relationship to God. But just as we ended up being forced to exit the maze through the easy, children's exit, just so it was Jesus, again, Who said emphatically, "Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it" (Mk. 10:15).

REDNER'S REGISTER TAPES

Redner's Warehouse Markets gives 1% of purchases back to the Women of the ELCA. This one percent can really add up! And the monies go to good things like the Mission Trip, VFW, Berk's Women in Crisis, just to name a few.

In order for Redner's to count the receipt (a.k.a. - register tape), it has to be the ENTIRE receipt, and it has to have a "save-a-tape" number on it. Use your pump perks card or save-a-tape card at the checkout. Then, just drop the ENTIRE receipt in the box at the ushers station in the narthex. DO NOT cut the bottom off. We only get credit for COMPLETE tapes! Also, please be sure to turn your tapes in in a timely manner, as Redner's will not accept any over three years old.


