Workshop Descriptions

Predator Awareness: This workshop will provide an in-depth explanation of the methods and tactics of sexual predators, the modus operandi of abuse, and an overview of facility safety concerns, policies, and practices in schools that represent managed risk and rapid intervention. The “vulnerable child” will be discussed as well as the predator mindset. This is formatted to provide a “train the trainer” approach so that participants will be able to carry over material their own safety presentations to the schools they serve.

Mandatory Reporting: This workshop will provide an in-depth explanation of Arizona’s Mandatory Reporting statutes regarding suspicions of child maltreatment. Included will be discussions of signs and symptoms, legal standard for reporting, relevant Attorney General Opinions, and recommended procedures for school employees who handle children who are suspected abuse victims and officers who respond to conduct the initial investigations.

School Security Officers: Many school security officers do not have an official training course designed to prepare them for working in the schools. This workshop will give both new and veteran school security an insight of best practices from an experienced High School security team. Topics discussed will include: Definition of Security, Observation, District/Institutions rules, Administrative support, SRO Relationship, How to treat students, Relationships with students, What teenage students go through, Schedule/Positions.

Vapes and E-Cigarettes: Electronic cigarettes, vape pens, vapes, Juuls, and other vapor products are increasingly showing up in high schools, junior highs, and even elementary schools. A recent study found that nearly 90% of youth who use these products believe that they are not ingesting nicotine but “just flavors.” However, state lab testing of vapor products confiscated in five Arizona high schools and junior highs found that 91% of products actually in use by youth did in fact contain nicotine. In fact, over half of the products contained extremely high levels of nicotine, high enough to cause serious injury or even death in very small volumes. Also, at least one e-cigarette device has exploded in an Arizona high school and dozens of injuries have occurred from device explosions across the state.

Restorative Justice Intervention: A theory of justice that emphasizes repairing the harm caused (or revealed) by criminal behavior. It is accomplished through cooperative processes that include all stakeholders. Instead of punitive measures, Restorative Justice focuses more on ensuring juveniles take responsibility for the harm they have done and seeks to make things right for those that have been wronged. Restorative justice brings together the accused, the victim, supportive parties and authorities.

Workshop Descriptions

Suicide Prevention: This workshop will enable the attendee to: Educate about teen suicide to aid in prevention and reduction. Learn about risk and protective factors for youth suicide. Bring awareness to some of the warning signs. Give guidance on what to do when someone talks about ending their life by suicide. Offer resources regarding suicide prevention.

Hearing Voices: This curriculum has been based off the work of Patricia Deegan, PhD from the National Empowerment Center. We have adapted, developed and piloted this training for a wide range of mental health and criminal justice professionals. Participants listen to distressing voices through MP3 players with headphones while completing a series of tasks; such as taking a mental status exam in a mock psychiatric emergency room.

Homegrown Violent Extremism: The FBI and Taskforce officers will discuss the Youth Radicalization by Islamic Terrorist Groups here in AZ and the United States.

Active Shooter Training for School Staff : This will enable the officer to identify the need for an active shooter workshop for school staff. Understand the process to create an active shooter workshop. Identify strategies to present active shooter material. Identify marketing strategies. Recognize the need for documentation.

Human Trafficking: The AZ Attorney Generals Office will present on Human Trafficking issues here in Arizona and how School staff can recognize and help combat this huge issue with the children in our care.

SRO/School Community Relationships: Participants will explore and understand how police officers might not be the best fit for a school campus. Participants will discover and consider that police Officers who are appropriately trained, understand the impact they have on school community members and the nation's youth, accept and implement precepts which produces and foster the most positive relationships, contribute to a feeling of safety, maintain the standards established through Procedural Justice principles as to not to contribute to the "school to prison pipeline", and recognize the honor to serve as and referred to as a School Resource Officer should be an active member of educational communities.

Right of Bang: (2 Part workshop) This class will assist attendees in understanding proactive and reactive responses to a Volatility, Uncertainty, Chaos, and Anxiety incident. You will understand an adaptive decision making model for dealing with these types of incidents. This will enable you to predict more, be situationally aware, let the Policing Priorities lead you.
