3.	<p>Business Arising from the Minutes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hot Lunch (Allyson) – Sourced ideas for hot lunch program when school resumes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Subway – 6 inch sub and cookie (\$5.50 profit \$1.00 to SPSC) Dominos Pizza – Individually boxed pizza (personal size \$6.00); drinks cannot be provided. Lynn’s Bakery – may also be an option. - Inquiry in process. May be able to run hot lunch options on a rotational basis. Hot lunch program can be implemented as soon as school resumes in person. QSP Holiday Fundraiser – \$124.83 was raised. QSP online store will remain open for balance of school year if anyone wishes to purchase in the spring or at a later date.
4.	<p>Principal’s Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the process of hiring two new LTOs to fill the vacancy of K. Morado and K. Simms. Hopeful to share more details of potential new hires soon. School building is closed for the time being. Custodial staff have been deep cleaning the building during this time. Andrea wished to recognize the outstanding work of the custodial team. Feeling fortunate to have such support from an amazing team who are so responsive to the needs of the building inside and out. The flagpole has been installed. The flag at the top of the building will be moved over the pole in the next few weeks as weather allows. With the transition to online schooling, the school has provided over 100 chromebooks to students and continues to make technological devices available to anyone who requires it to assist with online school. Google Classroom and Brightspace are utilized by teachers and staff to provide online schooling to students. School Messenger will continue to be primary means of communication from the school to the community. News to Families will be distributed more frequently to provide further engagement to the community. Covid-19 Safety and Protocols – N95 masks will be available to staff as requested and medical grade masks will be available for students as requested. Daily screening of staff and students will be key to ensuring a safe return to school.

Outstanding items already approved: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Forest of Reading and Graduation, \$1,928.55. We received \$325.44 from our Indigo fundraiser. Current available balance is \$3,290.59. No further funding requests were made.
