

## North Dakota Envirothon - State Competition - May 10-12, 2023 Checklist

- ☐ Team registration (online google form) - Due February 28, 2023
- ☐ Photo/health release form (one per student and advisor) - Due February 28, 2023
- ☐ The first 25 teams that submit a complete registration packet will be guaranteed a spot to compete in the competition. The top 2 teams from each regional competition receive free entry to the competition; however, they still need to register and complete all forms by February 28, 2023.
- ☐ Travel assistance grant - optional - Due March 15, 2023
- ☐ Local Soil Conservation District Support Letter - Due April 15, 2023 to ND Envirothon Coordinator
- ☐ \$50 registration fee (one per team), due May 10, 2023, check payable to ND Envirothon or mail to ND Envirothon Coordinator (email for address)
- ☐ Schools should bring one chaperone per gender you have attending the competition (ex. If you only bring a team of girls, you only need one woman chaperone; however if you bring a team of boys and girls, you need one woman and one man). Chaperone will stay in dorm rooms with their teams. Dorm buildings are gender specific.
- ☐ Crystal Springs Camp Team Expectations Document (to be signed at camp, but feel free to review in advance)
- ☐ The 1st place team from North Dakota will go on to the national NCF Envirothon Competition in New Brunswick, Canada. The 1st place team will receive: 1) \$500 for each of the five team members from the ND Envirothon and 2) NCF National Registration paid for which includes room and board at the national competition. The ND Envirothon DOES NOT pay for airfare, passports, and misc travel expenses to and from the national competition. The ND Envirothon encourages advisors to look into passport rules and timelines to make sure passports can be received in time for the [National Competition](#) (July 23-29, 2023).
