Cheri reported that the Nov. 3, 2020 election had to have been a record turn-out for Casco Township. There were 663 in-person voters, 1,041 absentee ballots sent, some of those surrendered their ballots so they could vote in person on election day that left a count of 1013 AV ballots returned, that made a 97.3% return on absentee ballots.

Overall we had a 64% turnout of registered voters.

Everything went as expected, maybe even better than expected. In the eight years I have been here I have never seen so many people and cars at an election. At one point I looked out my window and there was a car parked on the lawn, there were cars parked all along 71<sup>st</sup> St. on both sides of the road. The crowd was quiet, respectful to us, and to other voters, our new workers did a wonderful job. Some said they enjoyed it and want to help again. Clerk's love to hear that.

• SHAES: Allan mentioned again that Ron Ridley was named firefighter of the year, he has been a Firemen for 40 years, he started out on the Casco Volunteer Fire Dept then became a fulltime firefighter with SHAES.

• SHAWSA: Miami Parks sewer system is now merged with South Haven, this will make it so much easier if an individual wants to build on their property.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

• Final Marijuana Draft

Hartmann's first approached us in 2019 to grow Medical Marijuana in-doors. We toured their facility as a board, we have had discussions at several meetings, then CO-VID came, and everything stopped for several months. Ron Bultje, Township Attorney, was at one of our meetings by zoom, and thoroughly went over a draft ordinance, with the board.

It was understood that the board agreed they did not want an out-door growing facility, a processing facility, or retail sales in Casco Township. We have discussed this several times and Overhiser felt it was time to move on this. Would someone like to make a motion?

Lu made motion to approve the medical marijuana indoor growing facility requested by Hartmann's Plant Company, Lacota, Michigan,49063. Marijuana Regulation Ordinance No. 1116-20-1. Paul supported. No Further Discussion.

• Amend Zoning Ordinance

There were 4 amendments that were still hanging around that needed to be determined on.

1. Nuisance: -This word was used several times in the Zoning book so it was decided that this should be defined.

With a lot of discussion it was decided not to define the word.

Lu made motion not to adjust the word nuisance, to adopt out not to define the word. Cheri supported.

2. Excavations:

After discussion it was decided to send this amendment back to the PC to be re-drafted to include in the texting no ponding on neighboring property.

3. Outdoor Storage:

Section 3.17 Outdoor Storage Tasha changed it to read as <u>Recreational vehicle storage or parking</u> in residential districts.

After discussion Paul made motion to approve this amendment as written. Lu supported. No further discussion.

Kathy has been talking to Pitney Bowes our present meter is out of contract, if something goes wrong with it we are responsible for any repairs. We are currently under a month to month agreement, the current model is 7 yrs, old.
