HOW YOU CAN SHOW GOD'S GRACE TO THE WORLD

You've probably seen the bumper stickers. They're everywhere. Those emblems of Islam, gay rights, Judaism, paganism, Taoism, and Christianity are often arranged in an attempt to spell *coexist*.

Nice idea—that people would leave others alone who wish to practice a different kind of religion. However, the bumper stickers are not changing the minds of Al Qaeda, Boko Haram, al-Shabab, and ISIS, who support killing in the name of their religion.

So how can we as Christians go beyond the bumper stickers—and effectively share the news of God's grace?

First, let's remember Christ told us not to judge others (Matthew 7:1). In his parable of the weeds and the wheat (Matthew 13:24-30), Jesus told his disciples that it's not up to us to separate the believers for heaven and the unbelievers for hell. Christ himself will take care of that when he returns.

In the meantime, let's proclaim the universal gospel of a God who so loved the world that he gave his only Son. Coercion cannot convert even one unbeliever. Only the gospel of God's love can do that.

But that doesn't mean that all faiths are equal. Jesus said that no one can come to the Father except through him. Jesus claims to be not just one of many paths to God but *the* Way, *the* Truth, and *the* Life.

As the apostle Peter told the high council in Jerusalem, "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

Though God's grace is universal, poured out over the world, only those who believe in his Son are saved by his grace.

You know, that's why we named our ministry Time of Grace—because our lives on earth are our brief opportunity to reconnect with God through the gospel of Christ. And that's why Christians want to coexist with other people—to give them every opportunity to hear and believe the Word that saves. So let's make the most of our time on earth by showing the world his amazing grace.

Excel in the Grace of Giving!

2 Corinthians 8:7

But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God's grace is a giving grace; it centers around his gift of Jesus Christ and his redemptive work on our behalf. That grace moves the Christian to be gracious—to freely, gladly give everything, including his material goods, back to the Lord. The offerings of a Christian, then, are much more than bills and coins. They are a part of one's worship. The Christian who day by day is being "graced" by God acknowledges God's grace with freely given, grace-motivated gifts.

In response to the grace of our God, we as a family of believers - united by the Spirit, have successfully paid off our organ fund, totally roughly \$113,000. What an incredible blessing this is! To God be all glory!!!

This instrument, God-willing, will be used for decades to come and will be used to give glory to our God. We thank you for your gifts, prayers, and encouragement over the years to see this project through.

While the organ project is completely funded, we now have the opportunity to pool our resources together and to work on both our general fund giving and our debt fund.

Our debt fund has been needed more this year than it has in the past. As a result, we have nearly maxed out our line of credit with the bank at \$150,000. Our congregational goal, as encouraged by our Board of Trustees, is to reduce that line of credit to under \$100,000 by July 2018.

Our leadership at St. John's also wants to stress the importance of giving our first-fruits to the Lord. We need about \$15,000 per week in General Fund giving in order to pay our bills. All we are asking of you is to simply give as God has given to you. Don't ask others to pay their fair share or get mad at those that aren't giving or those that you think could give more. That is not your business, but it is God's. God desires cheerful giving that is sacrificial giving. God loves giving that is thought out and planned for. Above all, God loves giving that is motivated by his Grace as we read in our passage above.

By God's grace, we can meet our goals. By God's grace, our sins have been forgiven. By God's grace, we have been called into God's family. By God's grace, he continues to love and care for us. According to the grace that God has personally given to us, let us give back to the Lord, our God.

February is Heart Disease Awareness Month

Heart disease is the number one cause of death for both men and women in the United States. It is an equal opportunity killer which claims approximately 1 million lives annually.



You can make healthy changes to lower your risk of developing heart disease. Controlling and preventing risk factors is also important for people who already have heart disease. To lower your risk:

Choose a Heart Healthy Lifestyle...

- 1. Engage in regular moderate aerobic exercise for at least 30 minutes five days a week or more vigorous workouts at least 20 minutes three times a week. (See your physician before starting any exercise program.)
- 2. Adopt a diet low in salt, saturated and transfats and high in unsaturated fats (fish, avocado, etc.) like the Mediterranean Diet.
- 3. Maintain a normal body weight with caloric adjustment.
- 4. Take fish oil supplements.
- 5. Avoid smoking and recreational drug use.
- 6. Imbibe no more than ½ to 1 alcoholic beverage per day.

Uncontrolled high blood pressure is a leading cause of heart disease. High blood pressure often shows no signs or symptoms, which is why having your blood pressure checked regularly is important. It's easy to get your blood pressure checked. St. John's Nurse Parish Ministry holds a FREE Blood Pressure Clinic every 3rd Sunday between services.

Know and review your risk factors with a trusted physician. Your physician may recommend medications to control cholesterol, hypertension and diabetes. For more information visit the American Heart Association website at www.heart.org


