I would like to offer you some encouragement with the words of David when he was told by Saul that he could not go against Goliath.

And Saul said to David, Thou art not able to go against this Philistine to fight with him: for thou art but a youth, and he a man of war from his youth. And David said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock: And I went out after him, and smote him, and delivered it out of his mouth: and when he arose against me, I caught him by his beard, and smote him, and slew him. Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be as one of them, seeing he hath defied the armies of the living God.

The Lord has brought me through several "lions" and "bears" since He saved me, and I know that the prayers that all of you offered up on my behalf had a great deal to do with the grace and mercy that the Lord has bestowed upon me. So, again, thank you for being so faithful to pray for me and Janice!

I know that some of you may be dealing with some "lions" and "bears" in your life even today, and now, all of us are facing a giant, a Goliath, in this coronavirus pandemic. It is a "giant" that we have never faced before, and it is BIG! Only our Almighty God knows what the outcome will be. My answer to you concerning your "lions", "bears", and now this "giant" is David's statement in the very next verse.

David said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine. And Saul said unto David, Go, and the LORD be with thee. –I Samuel 17:37

It was the Lord that delivered David, and it will be the Lord that delivers all of us. We don't know all of the hows, the whys, the bumps in the road between here and there, or how long it will take; but we can be assured that it will be the Lord that brings us through it.

We have come to a time in our lives when the whole world has been stirred up. The very foundation of our society has been shaken, and I can guarantee you that no one on this earth has all of the answers. I have read and heard people say that this pandemic is God's judgment on the earth, or they have asked that question. I've read that others say that it is a lesson from God. Yet, we don't find many in authority or the "talking heads" on the news advising us to seek God for help during this crisis. There have been a few that have acknowledged God and encouraged people to pray, but not very many. Well, did God cause this viral pandemic and rain it down upon the earth? I don't claim to be a great theologian or Bible scholar, or to know any more than anyone else about anything; but my answer is "no". There are several accounts in the Old Testament where God rained down fire from heaven, and sent plagues, pestilence, famine, and other judgements upon the earth; but to the best of my knowledge, there are no accounts of that in the New Testament. There are prophesies of judgement upon the earth in the Book of Revelation, but those will occur after the rapture of the Church. So, is this viral pandemic God's judgement upon the earth?
