Needlepoint and Cross Stitch

Needlepoint has roots in the Egyptians era, 1,500 BC, was found in Pharaoh Tombs. Cross Stitch goes back to the 6th and 7th centuries.

Gloria Broadbent began sewing at age 10 and started doing needlepoint 40 years ago. She favors the 13 holes to square inch canvas.

She defined the difference between Needlepoint and Cross Stick as: Needlepoint starts with a canvas and ends with a cloth. And Cross Stitch starts with a cloth and adds thread.

(Needlepoint/Cross Stitch continued)

Needlepoint canvas start at \$30-40 and go up to \$100 or more, plus thread, putting together, and possibly framing. She works on them about 10 hours at a time. Smaller ones can be done in one month.

Gloria brought her framed Rhino, red Baby Block Hassock, 2 pillows, Rat Boy pillow, green pillow done from Art Nouveau Book 1900s drawing, Ukraine pattern piano bench cover, Magnolia piano bench cover done by Gloria's Mother, blue birds, urn, etc.

She had a new design for another piano bench cover but did not complete it; it just was not enjoyable to her. She feels that if you are not enjoying the project, move to something else. Gloria brought two unfinished projects from 10 years ago and gave to anyone who wanted to finish them. **Bonnie Theard** began in 1974 with a needlepoint class. She displayed green pillow, French Ribbon pillow, cars framed for her sons, butterfly kit, flower stamped design kit, bird pillow, framed apple, etc. She did have a hand painted canvas but lost it in Katrina. Bonnie's collection pictured below.



Danielle Joachim brought items she did from sampler kits. She mentioned that DNC thread was founded in 1746 and Ada fabric founded in 1890. Before special fabric they used linen which was woven loosely enough to do counted cross stitch. She also suggested practicing on paper.



Charlotte Baham has been doing cross stitch since she was 10 years old. Her first kit was a stamped baby bib. She brought Birth samplers, Gardener's Alphabet, and Finding Grandmother's buttons. (shown below)
