Nugget Hunting In Dry Placer Diggin's And Dry Washes

Old placer diggin's and the bottom of dry washes are often productive and rewarding locations for nuggets. In remote desert areas where water has never been available and where the only method of recovery is with a dry washer or by dry panning, there are millions of dollars worth of small nuggets. These nuggets are rarely detectable by eyesight, but they lie in the surfaces or at very shallow depths. Investigation with low lying areas with a highly sensitive, ground canceling metal detector can be very rewarding. Some knowledgeable nugget hunters have done very well over the years by working dry or desert areas in highly mineralized locations and by working areas where large gold nuggets were found by early day prospectors. Do your research! The use of a metal detector is practically the only method of locating nuggets in these areas; it is certainly the quickest.

Again, the VLF/TR type detector is the best choice for nugget hunting. The 7 to 8 inch coil will give the greatest depth, yet is sensitive to small nuggets. The ground mineralization canceling circuitry will certainly make this type of detector easiest to use.

After you have correctly tuned out the ground mineralization according to the manufacturer's suggestions, you should scan with the search coil held an inch

or two above ground surface. CAUTION: The search coil operating height will always be determined by the amount of mineralization present. Greater than 2 inch operating heights may be required. Be confident that your VLF type detector is doing a good job for you. Be aware that all detectors are not suitable for prospecting and that poor results yielded by some detectors have actually caused the hobbyist to quit this interesting and profitable pursuit. The VLF circuitry will penetrate black sand with ease and pick out the nuggets.

Again, you may run into highly mineralized, out of place hot rocks and, again, the TR discriminator circuit of your VLF will enable you to unmask cleverly concealed nuisances instantly. The recovery of nuggets from dry sand is achieved basically the same as from a stream. Slip your shovel under the sand where you get the signal; place the material in a plastic gold pan and check it out with your metal detector. If you fail to get a reading, dump the pan and repeat the process. When your detector verifies the target is in the pan, make a visual search. If you are unable to locate the target, dry pan until you find

A good VLF/TR discriminator will amaze you with the number of things it will enable you to recover from the desert. A little practice and experience will make you an expert in no time!

"No Gold Sales" Says Nevada Senator

Reno. Nevada (AP)

Senator Richard Bryan (D-NV) is assuring gold producers in Nevada and around the world that Congress will block the Clinton administration's attempt to sell off international gold reserves to help some debt-laden poor countries.

"It requires congressional approval. It ain't going to happen." Bryan says.

Bryan, a senior member of the Senate Finance Committee, outlined the dim prospects for the International Monetary Fund gold sale during a confirmation hearing June 17 for Lawrence Summers, the current deputy Treasurer Secretary.

Bryan tends to support President Clinton's nomination of Summers for the top treasurery job, but vowed to block any effort to sell of 10 million ounces of IMF gold reserves.

The sell off would devastate gold markets already hovering around 20-year lows, and probably hurt the heavily indebted countries the IMF is trying to help, he predicted. Not to mention harm to miners in Nevada, which is the worlds No. 3 gold producer behind South Africa and Australia. The state had a record output of 8.86 million ounces last

year worth \$2.6 billion.

But low prices have led to layoffs. "The recent drop in the price of gold has caused the layoff of over 1.000 mining employees in the state of Nevada alone," Bryan said.

Other high powered Senate opponents of the IMF gold sale include Minority Leader Tom Daschl (D-SD), and Frank Murkowski, (R-AK), chairman of the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

A White House spokeswoman said there was no immediate response to Bryan's assurances that Congress would reject the sale.

The plan to sell the gold is intended to to raise money for the 41 poor countries included in the IMF's Heavily Indebted Poor Countries Initiative (HIPC).

Those 41 poor countries have a combined debt of \$220 billion, Bryan said. Of the 41, at least 14 produce a significant amount of gold. As a result in the decline of the price of gold, they have lost \$150 million in export earnings, he said.

"Not only do you create turbulence in the domestic gold-producing market, you accomplish very, very little for the countries you are trying to help," Bryan said in the telephone interview. "I'm not unsympathetic to what they are trying to do. But in effect, you disrupt a whole industry in the process. It just doesn't make sense to me," he said.

Gold prices have been hovering around \$260 a troy ounce-the most depressed level since Jimmy Carter was in the White House.

Summers wouldn't say during the hearing whether the administration would reverse course in the proposed sale. But Bryan thinks he got the message.

"This is my third conversation with Summers," the senator said. "I just wanted to send a shot across the bow. This ain't going to happen."

Gold rush wagon train reaches Sierra

A wagon train celebrating the 150th anniversary of the California gold rush has reached the east slope of the Sierra Nevada, after leaving Kansas four months ago.

The Gold Rush Wagon Trail, one of several commemorating the anniversary, plans to cross into California today after campaign Genoa. The next camp, until Thursday morning, is in Woodfords, California.

The group is commiserating the rush to California's gold fields with five authentic, mule driven covered wagons.

The modern-day pioneers left Atchison, Kansas on April 3. The size of the wagon train has ranged from 20 to 40 people traveling 20 to 25 miles a day on country and back roads, state and U.S. highways.

"This journey has tested and challenged all of us everyday. But that's been the idea from the start," said wagon master Russell Leger of Plattsmouth, Neb.

Leger said the 2,300-mile "Going for Gold" trek is aimed at providing a glimpse into the hardships faced by the early pioneers as they struggled to settle the West.

The wagon train is scheduled to reach its final destination, Sacramento, on September 3.

LOST DEER HUNTER MINE

During the depression a visiting deer hunter would spend two weeks every fall at the Bowler Ranch on the banks of the Reese River just a few miles south of the Lander County line. He regularly hunted in Barrett Canyon, due west from the Bowler Ranch, and nearly always bagged an animal.

One year the visitor was having a more difficult time finding deer than usual. He had hunted on into the late afternoon hiking high in the canyon up to timberline, where he decided to rest awhile. Leaning his rifle up against a tree, the hunter sat on a rock beneath a mountain mahogany to scan the countryside. His glance fell on a piece of pink quartz on the ground near his feet and he bent to retrieve it. The unusual color and its heavy weight prompted the hunter to put it in his pocket and then continue his search for game. At the ranch that night he remembered the rock and showed it to the Bowlers. They commented on its attractive color, so he presented it to them. It was promptly placed on a window sill, where it remained for ten years.

A prospector visiting them in the 1940's noticed the rock and saw traces of gold showing on the surface. He asked the bowlers for permission to have it assayed. When they agreed, but asked why he thought it valuable, he promptly broke the rock in half. The center was shot through with gold, and when the assay returns came in it ran \$100,000 to the ton!

The hunter who had originally found the specimen heard about the assay results. He immediately quit his job and spent the rest of his life searching Barrett Canyon for the source of the gold.

Few examples of rose quartz occur in the Shoshone Mountains. One batch of barren samples was found in the south fork of the canyon, but none of the myriad prospectors who have hunted for it have ever found more of the gold-bearing pink rock.

Tim Cody's Lost Ledge

In 1908, after the great strikes of Tonopah, Goldfield and Rawhide had drawn tens of thousands of people into the Nevada deserts, prospectors continued their search for bigger and better finds. Tim Cody was one such prospector and was that year camped at Stewart Springs some 15 miles from Goldyke. Using the springs as base, he systematically covered all of the surrounding country for signs of ore.

Eventually his supplies began to run low, so he decided to travel to Goldyke to obtain more. On that day, an overcast winter morning, he set out on foot for the store, 15 miles away. It was just his luck that the overcast blew into a storm and Cody got lost.

He located an abandoned mine tunnel and spent the night there somewhat protected from the storm. The following morning, with a clear sky, he started to climb a ridge nearby to get his bearings. Part way up he happened to stumble upon a rich gold vein in a quartz outcrop. Cody picked up a few ore samples and continued up the ridge. From the top, as he later stated, he could clearly see Paradise Peak as well as Rawhide Peak to the northwest. But even knowing the landmarks did not seem to help and he soon became lost again, reaching Goldyke after much difficulty. Once resupplied, Cody tried time and time to find the gold-laden quartz and always failed. Eventually after he gave up, and moved on, the story became just another half-believed Nevada legend. Then in 1949, three men appeared in the area searching for the lost ledge. Evidentially Cody had told someone about it who believed him, the three men had a map drawn by the prospector to guide

But Cody couldn't find the gold

and his map couldn't lead anyone to it. Somewhere in the hills south of Gabbs the ledge is still there. It may take someone getting lost to find it again.






