To be, or not to be

INCORPORATED

That is the question!



The Board of Trustees are considering starting the process of the Federation becoming a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). A CIO is a relatively new, alternative legal form for a charity which gives the charity its own legal personality and gives Trustees greater protection from being personally liable. Several Federations nationally have already completed this process. At present, SYFWI is an unincorporated charitable organisation and there is no protection from liability for any of the Trustees, who can then be held personally liable for any debts. This also applies to WI Committee members who are also “Trustees” of their own WI, so this is a situation that affects all WIs.

Becoming incorporated is recommended for Federations that own property and employ staff, both of which applies to our Federation and the cover would extend to all WIs in the Federation.

There will be further explanation at our Federation Annual Meeting on Saturday 20 April in Barnsley with voting on whether to proceed with incorporation. Trustees therefore, strongly recommend that all WIs send a Delegate to the meeting (who can attend free of charge), so that important information concerning this process can be fed back to every WI. OUR ENVIRONMENT MATTERS

Positive Steps for the Environment – Number 2

Let's Bin Litter!

The protection of the countryside has always been important to the WI. In 1954 the WI's resolution called for a campaign to 'preserve the countryside against desecration by litter'. This led to the foundation of the Keep Britain Tidy group.



Anyone who's been for a walk recently will know that 70 years later, litter is still a massive problem. Well, Keep Britain Tidy are still working on it! From Friday 15 – Sunday 31 March, they are organising 'The Great British Spring Clean' and all WI members are invited to take part.

Why do we need to pick litter?

To protect wildlife and marine life

To enable the government to spend the hundreds of millions of pounds a year currently spent on clearing up litter on other public services like social care and education instead

To avoid wasting resources such as plastic bottles, aluminium cans and glass bottles which are all recyclable. Each day, around 20 million drinks containers are 'lost from the loop' (this means they are not recycled)

To take care of our neighbourhoods and make them attractive and well-cared for

What can you do?

Take part in a local litter pick

Organise your own litter pick with your WI group

As an individual you could pick up litter on your street and ask your neighbours to help

Look at the information on the Keep Britain Tidy website

Every act to protect the environment, no matter how small, makes a difference.

You might like to focus on plastic waste and sign up to the Big Plastic Count which is being held 11 – 17 March. This is an investigation into UK household plastic waste. You count your plastic waste for a week and then send in the results. These results will be used to convince UK ministers to lead the way at the talks this year on a Global Plastics Treaty and push for a really strong treaty.
